## JACK DAW IN HOOPLAND

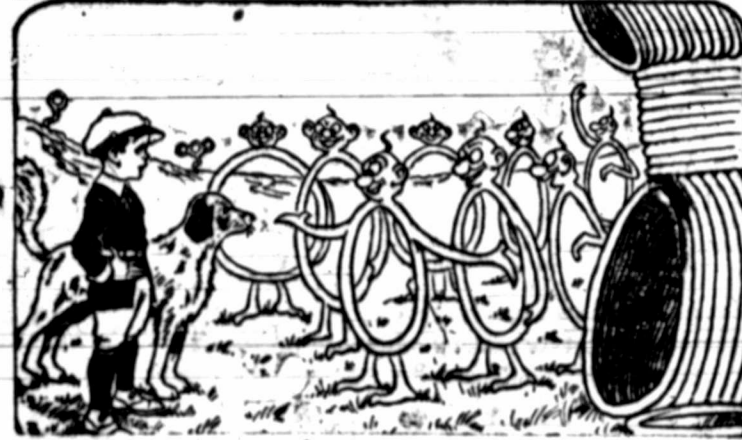

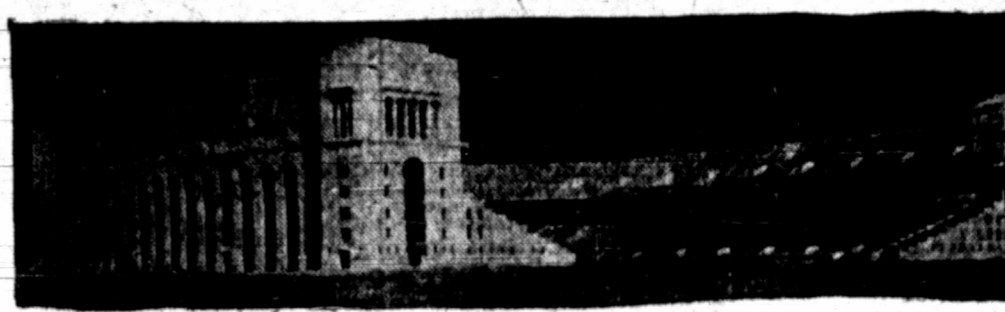
