OWSLEY OBJECTS TO VISIT PROPOSED BY TWO GERMANS

TIME IS NOT RIPE TO TEACH THEIR DOCTRINE, HE DECLARES.

GERMAN CROWN PRINCE MAY COME TO THE U. S.

Former Commander German Submarine is Scheduled For Series of Addresses.

INDIANAPOLIS, Dec. 8.—Alvin M. Owsley, national commander of the American Legion, in an address here last night before a meeting of state adjutants of the legion, declared he had been informed that the German crown prince, Prince Rupprecht, was planning to visit this country by the German crown prince.

"I believe we would be entirely within our right to bar the crown prince's visit until we can settle the problems resulting from the war," Mr. Owsley declared.

A recent speech by Senator Borah in Chicago in which recognition of the Russian soviet government and executive clemency for political prisoners were advocated, was attacked by the speaker, who declared the "American Legion is opposed to both measures."

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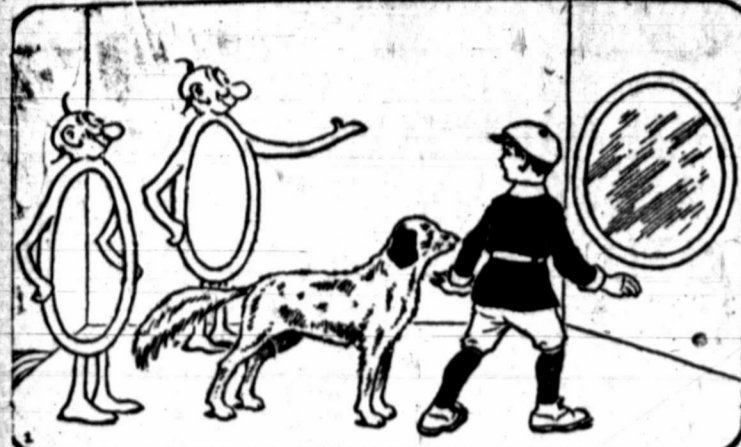

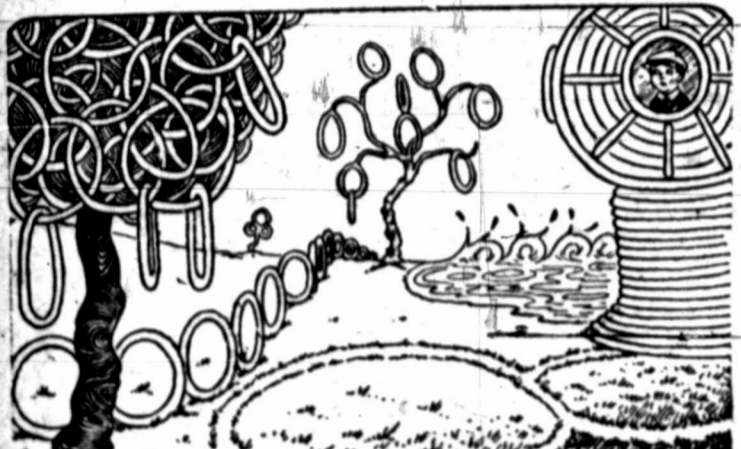

JACK DAW IN HOOPLAND

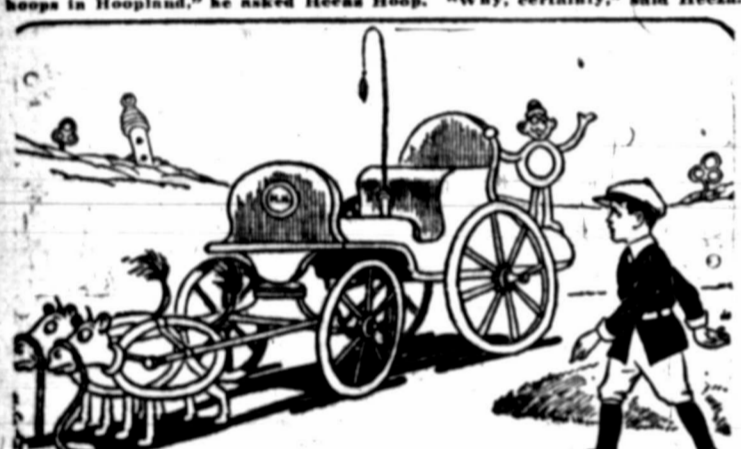
