How to Make an Extension Clothes Rack

Use 3/4" or 1" dowel rods. In testing these for fits, the end pieces should be held in the vise in the same manner as when the holes are bored, thus preventing splitting.

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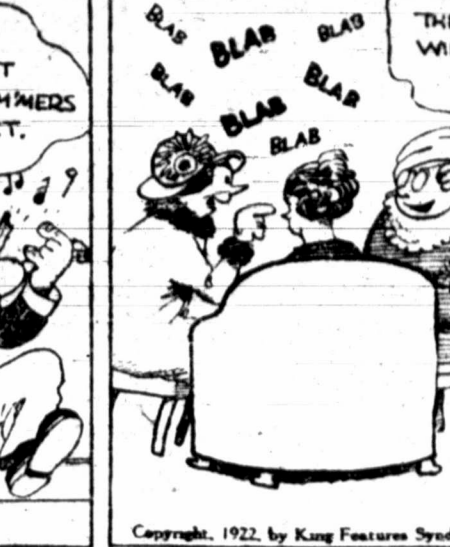
