### CONFESSION OF ANOTHER TO FREE CONVICT IN OHIO

HAS SERVED FIVE MONTHS OF LIFE SENTENCE FOR MURDER

#### ALL HAVE OUR TROUBLES HE TOLD THE WARDEN

"Haven't Felt So Very Bad Because I Know I Wasn't Guilty," Says Victim

By Associated Press. COLUMBUS, Ohio, Feb. 21.—Three fateful words, "I am guilty," from the lips of another man and an indefinite number of years behind the bleak gray walls of the Ohio penitentiary had dwindled into hours today for Clarence Leroy McKinney (convict 11110), who five months ago began a life sentence for murder.

He and two companions, all named, were removed from their obstructive position Tuesday afternoon, and were placed in jail for a while. Later they made bond and were released. Work was resumed on track-laying as soon as the tractor and the sub-contractor were removed.

### GOVERNOR URGES BILL TO EXPEDITE CRIMINAL CASES

WOULD DIVIDE STATE INTO FIVE SPECIAL JUDICIAL DISTRICTS

#### PLANNED TO RELIEVE CONGESTED CONDITION

Indicates Many of Bills for New District Courts Will Be Voted

AUSTIN, Feb. 21.—Governor Neff appeared before the house this morning to advocate passage of a bill prepared under the supervision of the attorney general's department which would facilitate and expedite trial of criminal cases in Texas. The bill would divide the state into five judicial districts, each district to be presided over by a specially appointed judge having the same qualifications as a regular district judge. The special courts would have concurrent jurisdiction with local district courts.
