

PAYING, PLUMBING AND BUDGET KEEP COUNCILMEN BUSY

TWO SETS OF CONTESTANTS HAVE SOME AGRIMONIOUS DISCUSSIONS.

NO DECISIONS REACHED ON PENDING QUESTIONS

Vigorous Attack is Made On City Plumbing Inspection Methods; Budget Adopted.

For four hours Monday night the city council listened to and occasionally took part in one of the stormiest sessions since the settlement of the traction company franchise on Avenue U. The first discussion arose over the paying of Austin street from Eleventh to Twelfth streets. This settled, a resolution of plumbers took the floor and through their counsel attacked the city plumbing ordinance and charged that discrimination was being shown in its enforcement.

C. C. McDonald, representing S. M. Hodges, opened the argument on the paying question when he declared that the ordinance authorized by the council on Austin street between Eleventh and Twelfth streets was not a public necessity and that it would not enhance the value of the Hodges property to the amount of the assessment for the paying, and that the paying contemplated would not be uniform with that on the front of Mr. Hodges' property. For these three reasons he requested the council to consider the protest of Mr. Hodges who owns a lot of 140 feet frontage on Austin street.

Speaks for Property Owners. Judge A. H. Carrigan, spokesman for the other property owners on the block, took the floor in behalf of the proposed paying. He was followed by J. A. Richott, A. Zundelovits and other property owners in that section who favored the payment. It was stated that the majority of the property owners in the 1800 block on Austin had agreed to pay. This question removed a portion of Mr. Hodges' objection since he argued that the payment "started nowhere and lead nowhere."

Mr. Hodges spoke at length on his reasons for opposing the paying. He contended that he had not been consulted as to the kind of paying to be laid and that the proposed paying would call for an unnecessary expenditure.

ALLIED CONFERENCE ON RUHR OCCUPATION REACHES AGREEMENT

SHARP DISCUSSION DEVELOPS OVER NUMBER OF QUESTIONS.

ABSOLUTE SECRECY AS TO POINTS AT ISSUE

Attach Much Importance to Political Aspect of the Conference.

BRUSSELS, March 12.—Although an accord was reached at the Franco-Belgian conference here yesterday on the fundamental points in connection with the Ruhr occupation, there were sharp discussions over a number of questions, it developed today.

The technical phase of the conference resulted in a general agreement on the policy to be pursued in the Ruhr and on the arrangements for getting out coal from the valley, but those in touch with the proceedings attached higher importance to the political aspects of the meeting.

The discussion that took place in the conference was kept absolutely secret.

The Belgians during the conference insisted at great length upon their points of view and it is asserted here that the gradual evacuation of the Ruhr as Germany pays was insisted on by M. Poincaré with reluctance.

Premier Poincaré had another conference with Premier Thomsen before leaving for Paris today.

The subjects of security for France and Belgium and the future conditions to be laid down for Germany were not mentioned in the communication about yesterday's meeting, but it is known they were discussed, the Belgians insisting particularly that at the proper moment all the allies should be brought into the conference. They made it plain that they wanted both security and reparation but they insisted upon remaining strictly within the treaty of Versailles.

The Belgians pointed out that they did not wish to do anything to offend Great Britain as they were obliged to look to England for protection as well as to France. The Belgians said the whole situation should be frankly laid before the allies as soon as Germany acknowledges defeat in the Ruhr and they insisted also, it is understood, that all the allies and the United States should be informed that the Anglo-American refusal to ratify the guarantee treaty negotiated at Versailles at the same time as the German peace treaty had created a new situation and that the French and Belgians were bound to consider the question of their security in this new light.

One of the sharpest bits of discussion is understood to have arisen over the question of consolidation of the French regime in the Ruhr and the Rhineland. The Versailles treaty provides that the Rhineland shall be occupied only a maximum of 15 years after the Germans begin a loyal execution of the treaty. The Belgians are desirous to have pointed out that their interests would be affected if the French intended to remain in the Rhineland permanently.

CANDLER FILES AN ANSWER TO DE BOUCHEL SUIT

ATLANTA, Ga., March 12.—With a possibility of the trial coming up in the September term of federal court here, as A. G. Candler, Atlanta soft drink magnate, had on file today an answer to the petition of Mrs. Onestina de Bouchel of New Orleans in the \$100,000 heart balm suit recently sought against the manufacturer.

The answer, while admitting correspondence with Mrs. de Bouchel and proposal of marriage to her, denies the statement of the plaintiff that she had suffered any damages in the breaking of the subsequent engagement, and asked that the petition of the plaintiff be dismissed. The document further set forth the defendant admitted he wrote Mrs. de Bouchel a letter in which he broke the engagement after he had been reported to him "from sources he was bound to believe" that two men had visited her during the Confederate invasion in Atlanta for improper purposes.

Want of "sufficient evidence" the answer said, made him unable to affirm or deny the statement of her innocence of the charges. Mr. Candler further averred that no investigations of Mrs. de Bouchel were made other than to establish that statements regarding her alleged conduct were made by a "gentleman in Atlanta." The answer admitted the objection of members of the defendant's family to the proposed marriage.

RESCUE TWO FROM SMALL MOTOR BOAT ADRIFT FIVE DAYS

FREEPORT, N. Y., March 12—

Five days adrift in a small motor boat and food and water gone, Bergen Smith, Jr., and Harry Matthews (fishermen), were landed yesterday at Long Beach by a schooner from the Bahamas which had picked them up on the verge of death last Friday.

Matthews was delirious from having drunk salt water. Smith had recovered sufficiently to be able to tell of their adventure. He said they had put out a week ago last Sunday. Something went wrong with their compass and they confessed themselves lost. To save gasoline they killed their motor and drifted until the schooner found them. They had survived a heavy snow storm though their bodies were bruised and bleeding from the tossing they received. Some raw potatoes, a pie and a gallon of water, their only provisions, were soon gone and Matthews in the agony of thirst drank ocean water.

The boat started to leak and they had to rip the linings from their overcoats to plug the seams. Day and night they pumped until Matthews became delirious and Smith had to battle alone to keep the boat from sinking.

On the third day they saw a steamer on the horizon. They hoisted a burlap bag on an ear but the steamer was too far away.

On the fifth day, he hope fast was fading, they sighted the Bahama schooner. Frantically they waved their signal again, this time with success.

"GAT" CAME BACK.

The birds that build their nests near your house this spring probably will be the same ones that camped near you last year. So claims H. Knight Horsfield in his new book, "Birdsights on Birds."

Patriotism, or the instinct of seeking old homes year after year, is highly developed in birds. "The very fields and woods which constitute home for them being re-sought year after year."

How do they find their way back?

Horsfield writes that the strange way-finding power of migratory birds is leading up to the idea that there exists in birds an occult power which may be classed as a food-finding sense, separate from and additional to the five senses possessed by people and animal life.

Some of us, who are considered "queer," merely have a sixth or psychic sense.

Birds are very funny, Horsfield comments. He thinks the lure that makes them return to former homes is their "passionate attachment for their native lands—their true home—in which the most fascinating period of their lives is spent."

Horsfield also claims that certain bird families have distinct sense of the rights of property. Sometimes they fight and drive out invaders of what they consider their exclusive territory. "With rooks it is clear that a given belt of trees is marked out as the property of a particular colony." In other words, a fence.

All of us have recognized, in cats and dogs, this instinct which brings them back to their former homes. As the old saying goes, "The cat came back."

But the cat will not come back unless it has attention for its old home or kittens that need its care, according to Prof. F. H. Herrick of Western Reserve University.

The cat, says Herrick, returns home by the power of orientation, a sense of direction. "This power of orientation is a keen sense of muscular feeling, far keener than that possessed by the human body. It, a cat knows instantly in which direction home lies, through the feeling of its muscles. It is sense of direction in its most acute form."
