# MEETING WHEAT GROWERS PLAN TO MARKET THE CROP

WICHITA, KAN, March 26.—Discontinuance of the dumping method of marketing wheat and a possible control of the sales of one tenth of the annual wheat production of the United States may be the outgrowth of plans expected to be presented to the national wheat growers association which opened a two day session here today.

Five states compose the associa-tion and their annual production is tion and their annual production is estimated at more than 75,000,000 bushels, all of which would be controlled and marketed through the association, if the delegates accept the plan of the joint committee.

With Kansas, Oklahoma, Nebraska, Texas and Colorado as a nucleus the association hopes eventually to control the marketing of the eleven principal wheat growing states.
