CONY'S DAUGHTER ALLEGED LOOTER OF BANK IS ARRESTED

Trial of Defendant in Federal Court On Liquor Charge Does Not Bar State Court Trying Him on Same Charge

Judge P. A. Martin in delivering his charge of the grand jury impeached Monday afternoon stated that a man who had been tried in the United States district court on a prohibition law violation charge was not immune from prosecution in the state court on the same charge.

This issue has been tested out several times on appeal both to the court of criminal appeals in Texas and the circuit court of appeals at New Orleans. It has been held that a trial in either of the state or federal court does not preclude a man to be upheld in the state court of former jeopardy. Judge Martin stated to the jury that liquor law violations were frequent in Wichita county according to reports that had been communicated to him and that while the jury was investigating cases which involved a violation of the state prohibition act that they need not consider whether the man had been tried in federal court.

### RHINELAND SEPARATIST LEADER GOES TO PARIS

By Associated Press. PARIS, Oct. 10.—The presence in Paris of Dr. Dorten, the Rhineland separatist leader, is exercising the newspapers which maintain, notwithstanding denials at the foreign office, that he is here with the knowledge if not by invitation of the government to give an opinion on the Ruhr situation. The correspondents learn that he has told French officials they have made a mistake all through the occupation by not applying force ruthlessly. As an illustration, Dr. Dorten told the newspaper Le Courrier, that Fritz Thyssen was originally not hostile to the French. The magnate, going before M. Cote, said he was prepared to collaborate with the economic mission if he could be assured of serious support from the French. Inasmuch as he could get only vague statements from M. Cote, Herr Thyssen after waiting a week, said he had decided to obey Berlin. A few hours later the German industrialist was arrested. This act according to Dr. Dorten, had the effect of uniting all the Germans in their resistance to the occupation.

### Arrest of an Obscure Chinaman Reveals World-wide Ramifications Of Big "International Dope Ring"

By Universal Service. LONDON, April 10.—An obscure Chinaman, Tiew Yui Kim, arrested in a miserable cabin of a Chinese junk, has revealed the existence of the world-wide ramifications of the "international dope ring," and the enormous traffic in drugs of all kinds, from London to Hong Kong, and from Germany to the United States, Japan and China. The police here were staggered by these revelations and have been forced to reconstruct the whole of their ideas in connection with the drug traffic. The facts so far uncovered are:  
1. That British manufacturers are exporting large quantities of morphine and heroin yearly.  
2. That these drugs are exported to the continent of Europe and shipped either to Japan, China or the United States, and smuggled in.  
3. That the ring has headquarters in various leading seaports of Europe.  
4. That many prominent London merchants are engaged in this infamous traffic with agents on the continent, in the United States, China and Japan.  
One of the merchants engaged in this trade was convicted in London recently and sentenced to prison as the result of a careless slip which brought his drug dealing activities within the English law. This man, Howard Montagu Godwin Humphrey, was the man who had been arrested under what was ostensibly a cutlery business, and a score of other prominent merchants have been dealing in drugs behind the mask of legitimate trade.  
"Soon after the war Humphrey linked up with service of big Chinese firms who sought to purchase huge quantities of prepared morphine and heroin. Humphrey's part in the deal was to visit Paris and buy quantities of cocaine, morphine and heroin, an easy matter in the French capital, or in Berlin, or Darmstadt or Cologne, or Bucharest (where a factory has recently opened), and arrange for their shipment to his principals in China.  
Under the opium convention it is illegal to export into China any dangerous drugs, but Humphrey merely did what hundreds of other merchants are still doing. He reverted to the old

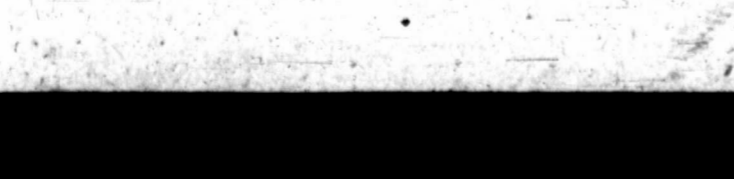

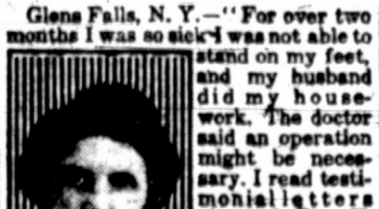
