President Harding is expected to spend two days of rest and enjoyment of nature's wonders in Yellowstone National Park. The presidential party will spend today and Sunday in the park, going to the national playground immediately upon arrival today at Gardiner, Mont., the northern entrance. Much of the two days will be devoted to motoring about the park, in much the same manner as the thousands of other American citizens who visit the place each season.

### Receiver Named For Four Wichita Oil Companies

KANSAS CITY, Kan., June 29 (AP)—Disclosure of alleged irregular financing in which are involved Oklahoma and Texas oil companies, including the American State Bank of Wichita, Kan., which recently closed its doors, has resulted in the appointment of G. W. Kyle as receiver for four oil companies. J. M. Reynolds, receiver of the companies, is reported to have disappeared. The companies declared to be in liquidation are the Oklahoma Oil Refining Company, the Matigold Oil and Refining Company, the St. Louis Oil Refining Company and the Big Four Oil Company.

### Zinc and Lead Mines Are Idle Affects 15,000

JOPLIN, Mo., June 29 (AP)—Approximately 15,000 men will be unemployed in Missouri as a result of the shutdown of zinc and lead mines in the state. The shutdown is the result of a strike by miners in Missouri, Kansas and Oklahoma. The district is the largest active zinc and lead field in the world.

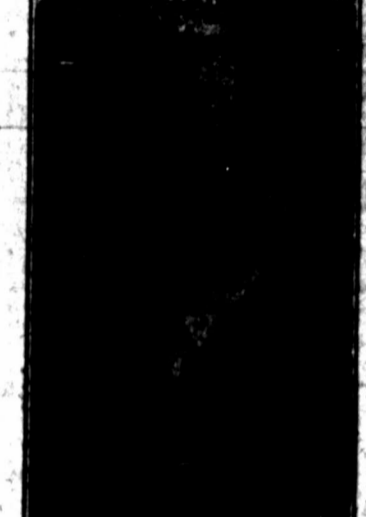

## TEXAS PIPE LINE COMPANY GREATLY LIMITS TAKINGS

The following notice governing transportation of oil was delivered by the Texas Pipeline Company to a number of local refiners and operators in this city, patrons of that transporting line:

"You have in our line a large excess of oil as of this date, and we hereby tender you same. We are ready to make you immediate delivery and if you refuse or fail to take same by July 6, 1934, demurrage will be charged under our bylaws and regulations covering such charges. Effective July 1, 1934, we will not accept for transportation any oil tendered us by anyone where the consignee is not able to receive the same promptly at point of destination when the oil is tendered. Under our rules and regulations, if tenders of oil for shipment are in excess of current deliveries, such tenders must be reduced to conform with current deliveries. The Texas Pipeline Company, J. L. Dowling, vice president."

The effect of this announcement is that after today a considerable portion of this section's crude will not be taken by the Texas Company. The company's declaration, that tenders must be reduced to conform with current deliveries, means that there will be no outlet for a substantial portion of northwestern Texas production, which has become too large for the need of refiners and buyers, and which has been accumulating in the lines and tanks of the company until relief measures of some sort became necessary.

**Here's An Aukward Situation**

Waco Times-Herald.—We have had an awful time of it—we here in America—bringing those we left behind in the olden days, and when the news of Burgoyne's surrender at Saratoga reached England, thus wrote to the Quakers of Garsay, December 1, 1777: "W. O. Nelson, I am satisfied, is an American, and he is an American, whether the true English, raised under Charles I." The American colonists had left behind institutions which were monarchical both in Church and State, and they was "fight to retain the democracy which they had come to value before they set sail for the New World. The powerful Pitt was on the side of America; the Whigs generally became pro-American, fearfully so in the opinion expressed by them that sympathized in America would also establish absolutism in England—this opinion expressed by Pitt, Fox, Horace Walpole, and Burke. According to Lecky, popular freedom was probably saved by England by the success of the American struggle. But not all of the things America stood for were agreeable at the outset to our English cousins, more particularly their government. The doctrine of freedom of the seas was first propounded by Grotius in his "Mare Liberum," which took for its text the sentence from the Roman Institutes, "The air, running water, the sea—are common to all." Selden answered with his "Causam," which defended the pretensions of England over the waters surrounding the British Isles. But by degrees, under the hammering of American logic, these pretensions have all gone into the discard. A significant point gained by the country is that which recognizes that private property should be immune from capture on the high seas in war time unless it was contraband or intended for a blockaded port. Another point, stressed by Daniel Webster while secretary of state, is that a ship in a foreign port is subject only to its own sovereignty, the what drew this country into the World War? On January 31, 1917, the German ambassador at Washington informed the state department that American passenger steamers would be permitted—mark the word—to continue sailings thereafter on certain prescribed conditions. On February 3, 1917, the president gave the German ambassador, Count Bernstorff, his passports and recalled Ambassador Gerard from Berlin. 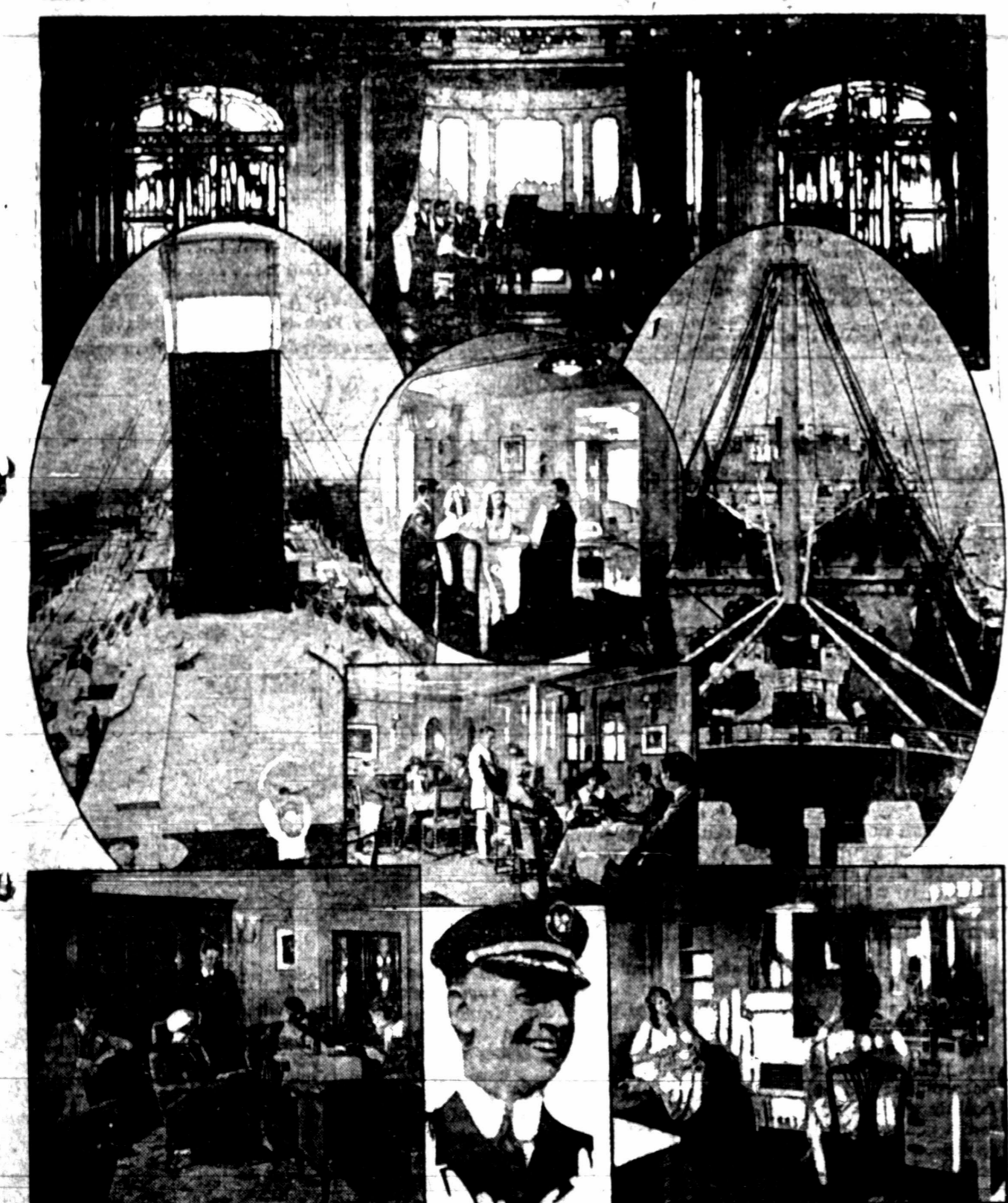

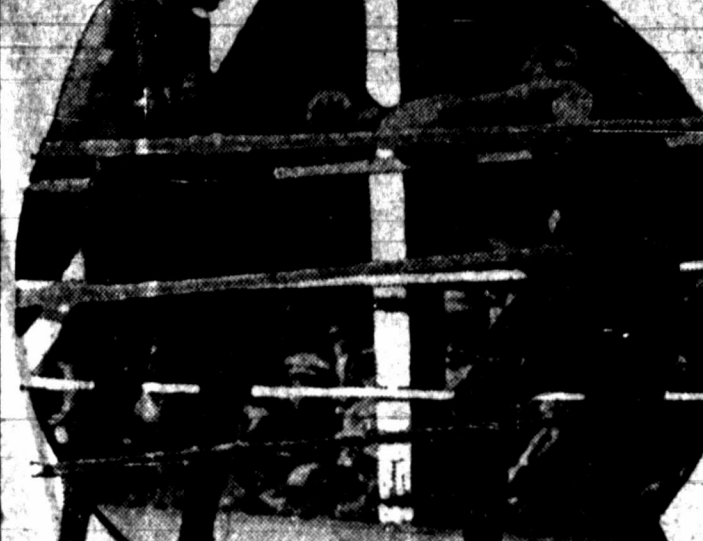
