Epitaphic View Body. 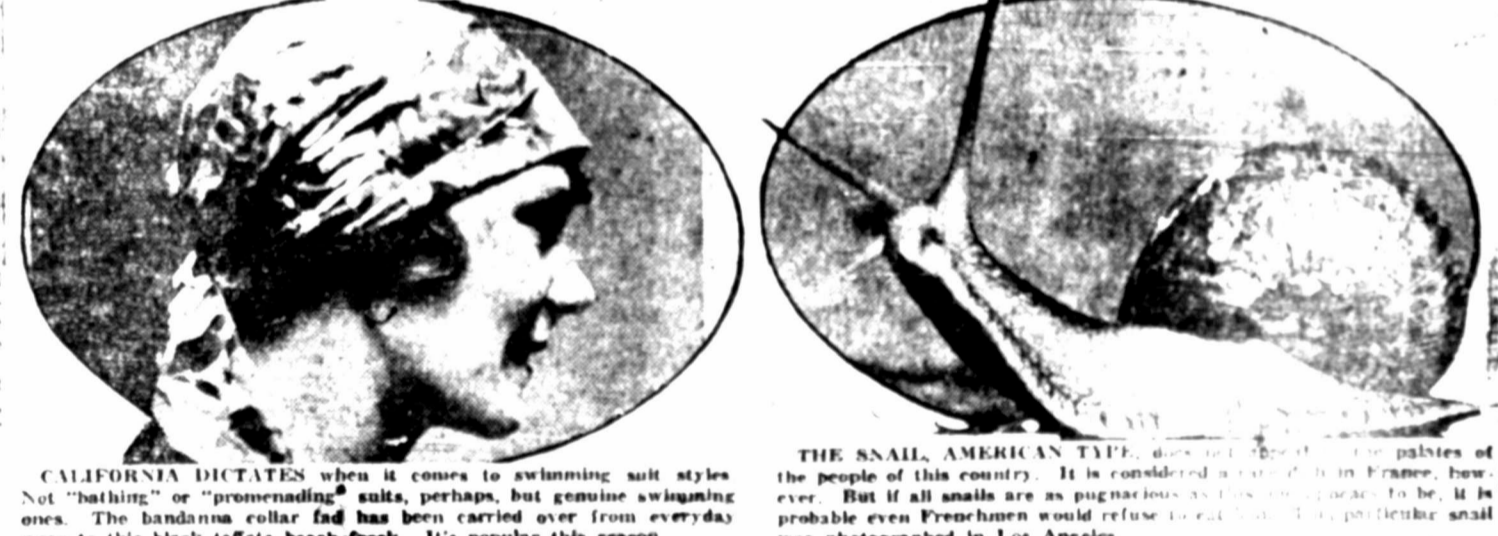
