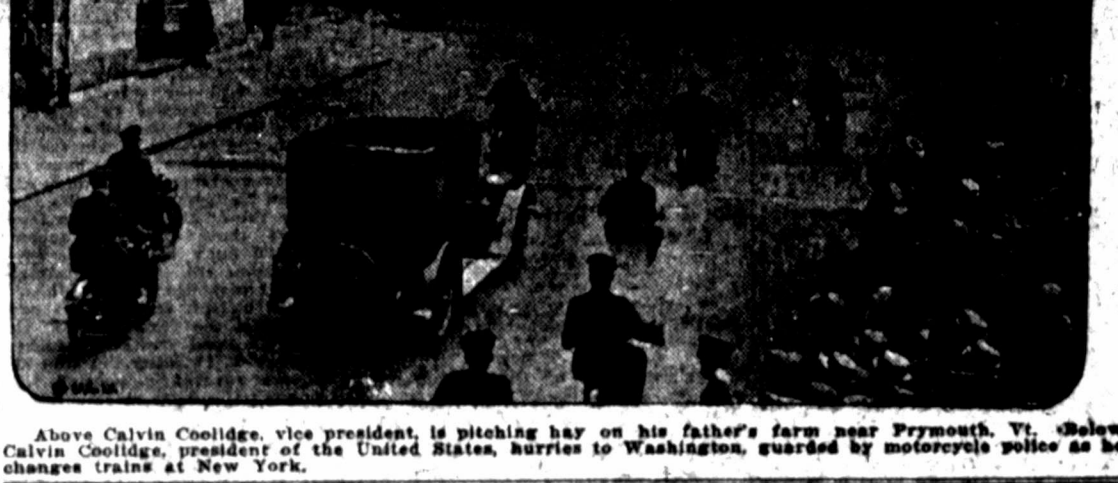

MELVIN CAMPBELL KILLED IN CRASH ON SEYMOUR ROAD

"Death by accident" was the verdict returned by Justice of the Peace O. L. Gibbs in the coroner's inquest over the body of Melvin Campbell, aged 25, a shopman for the Municipal Gas Company, who was instantly killed at 3:15 o'clock Thursday morning when an automobile in which he was riding struck an abutment of a bridge about seven miles out on the Seymour road. John H. Baker, Burkburnett, an employee of the Texhoma Oil & Refining Company, who was driving the car at the time of the accident, is charged with culpable negligence, and is being held in jail, suffering from bruises and minor injuries.

Baker and Campbell were returning from Freeman's hampton field in a Dodge truck when they saw another machine approaching them from Wichita Falls. According to the statements of the injured man, the car was traveling at a rate not exceeding 25 miles per hour. Baker was on the left side of the road and to avoid a crash with them he pulled his machine into the bridge abutment. In the crash the car in which they were riding turned completely over and pinned Baker underneath the body of the machine. Campbell was caught under the steering wheel.

FEARS IS HELD WITHOUT BOND AT ARCHER CITY

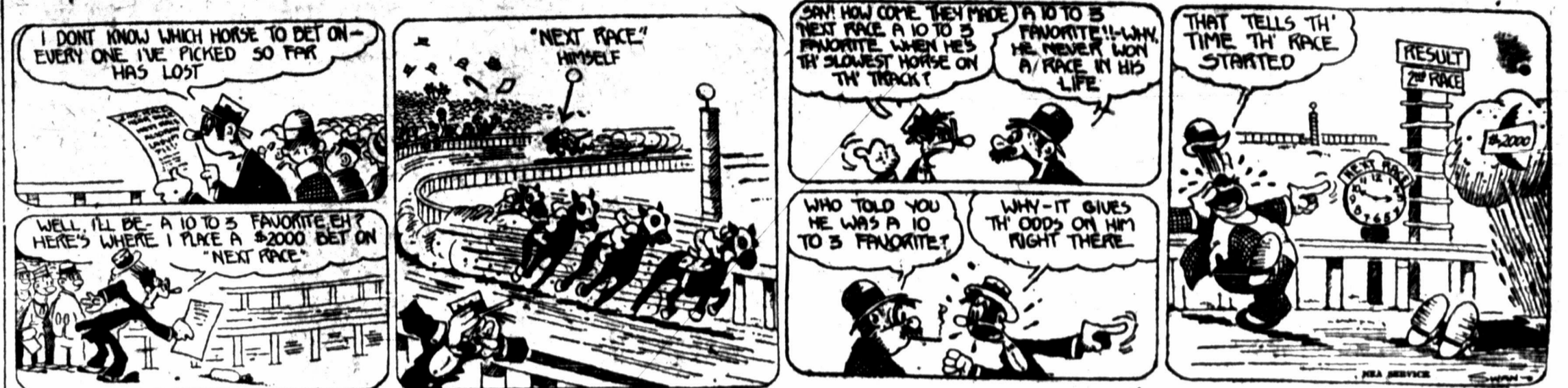

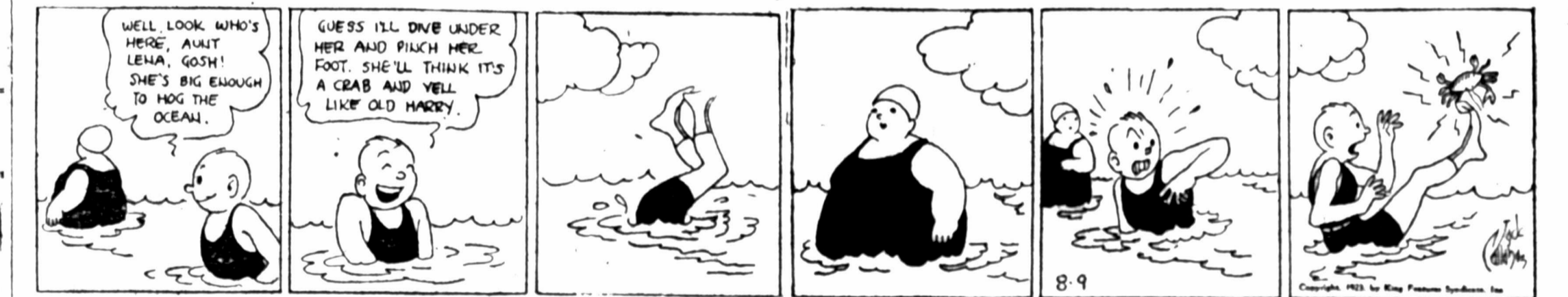

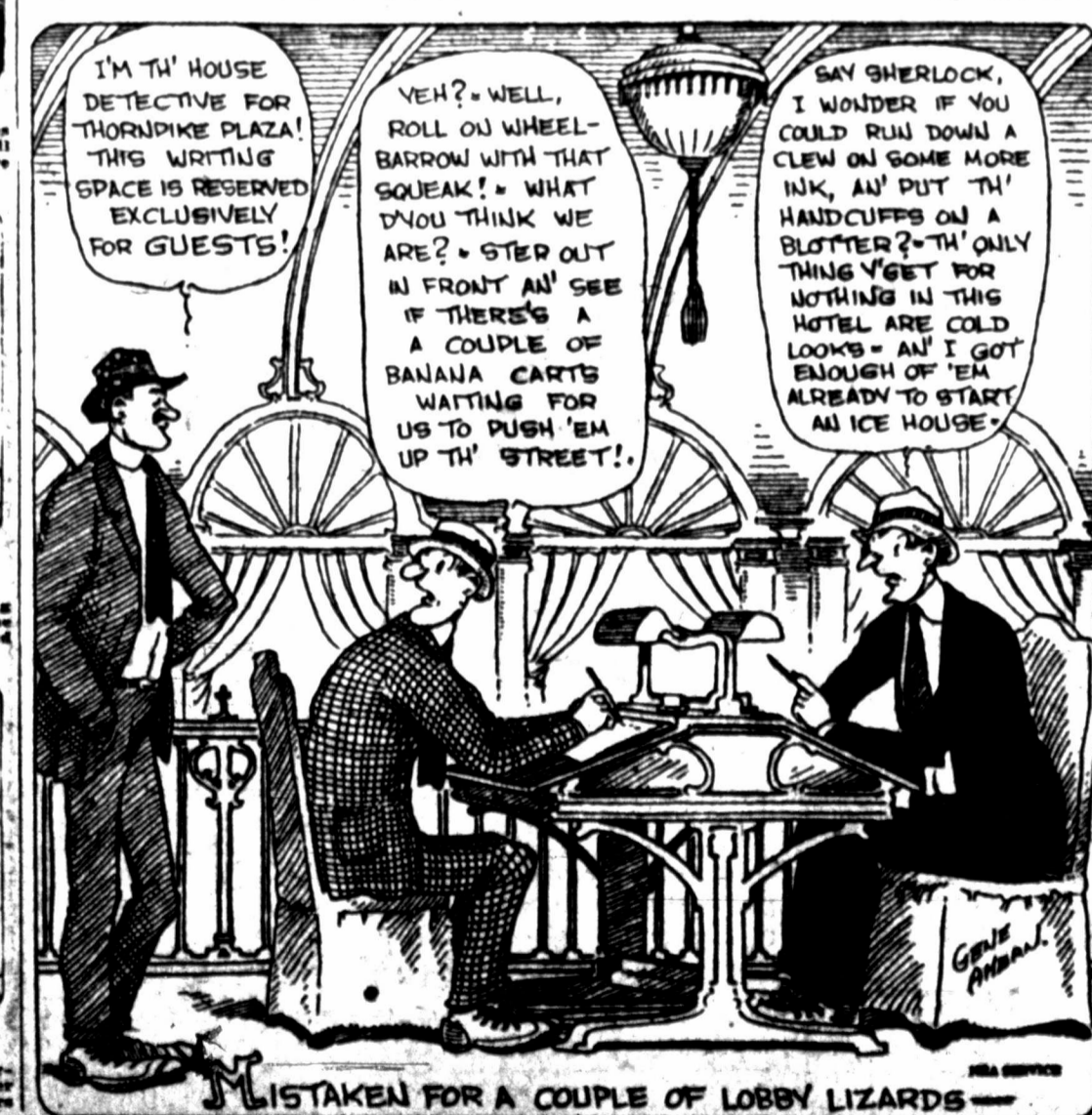
