## Deserve Punishment

We have checked several dictionaries, and there appears to be common agreement that a "church," whether a building (the Lord's house), or public worship (he goes to church regularly), or

a oarticular dennmination (the Baptist Church, the Catholic Church, etc.) has to do with the love of, or worship of, or belief in God.

In Austin, Texas, the militant athiest and independently wealthy Madalyn Murray (now O'Hair) has organized the Poor Richard's Universal Life Church. Mrs. O'Hair is best remembered,
