The funds-without a single cent of administrative or clerical salary—are to be used in attempting to destroy screwworm flies in South Texas, before they spread over the entire state. Such a plan is reported to have eradicated the expensive pests in Flordia and Georgia.

To raise financial quotas, livestockmen are being asked to voluntarily contribute 50 cents per animal unit. It is explained that an animal unit is one cow, or 10 head of goats or sheep.

High spot of the celebration for youngsters will be the appearance of Santa Claus and distribution of bags of Christmas candy by the local Boy Scout troop.





## DEER HUNTER KILLS 6 BIG RATTLERS SUNDAY

The weather has been cold but reptiles are not in complete hibernation for Winter. A. (Toad) Baucom of Cross Cut had ample proof of the point in town Sunday afternoon.

Hunting deer about a mile north of Cross Cut, Baucom sat down quietly to wait a possible shot. His attention was attracted to a sunny slope where six sizeable rattlers were buzzing busily. He shot the heads of three, however, the others scurried into a hole.

Largest of the rattlers was five feet long, had 12 rattlers and a button, and a mouth which opened to the size of a teacup. The snake was the type commonly called a "black ratt-
