sacred was not settled until the Council of Jamnia, about 90 A. D.

ed and gave most inspiration survived place for themselves in the cared an.
These include an out-and-out love song, which has no religious motive:
a book which does not mention the name of God, and another, Ecclesiastes
which is very contradictory. But the
