### WALLACE ASKED TO SPOT SUDAN PRICE AT 5 CENTS

Resolution Presented U. S. Aggi Secy. At Clovis Monday.

Following the address of U. S. Secretary of Agriculture Henry Wallace, definered at Clovis, N. M., last Monday morning, a resolution signed by representative citizens and growers of West sentitive citizens and growers of West presented to Mr. Wallace asking for federal recognition of sudan crop as one of the major production crops and a stabilization of the price of that commodity at the rate of five cents per pound.

The resolution was as follows:

We, the sudan producers of the Plains area of West Texas and Eastern New Mexico, request the assistance of the Secretary of Agriculture in stabilizing the price of sudan seed.
