## ASCS Office Cautions Farmers On Procedure

It is important each farmer participating in 1966 annual programs completely understand in order to be eligible for payments the crop must be planted and worked in a workmanlike manner with the expectation of producing a normal crop," stated J. C. Earp, Baird ASCS manager. "This means that land preparation, planting, and cultivation of the crop must be the method normally followed by farmers in the community," he pointed out.

It was explained that any acreage which the county committee determines was not planted in a workmanlike manner will not earn full diversion or support payments or be planted as planted acreage.

Continued, "In making this determination, the committee will consider seedbed preparation, manner and time planted, quantity and pounds of seed used, planting if necessary, and method of cultivation and care of the crop received.

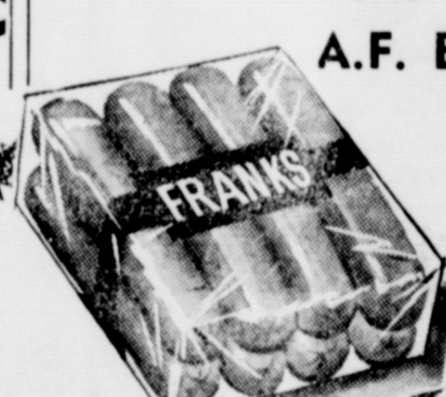
