## NEW RURAL ENVIRONMENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FOR '71

BAIRD — Top farm program officials from Texas will be in Phoenix, Ariz., this week for a first hand briefing on the new Rural Environmental Assistance Program (REAP) for 1971.

Clarence A. Danklefs, Chairman of the State Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation (ASC) Committee, will head the delegations from Texas that will include State Committee members Charles L. Calhoun, Frank H. Hinkson, John Barry Rudd and Jose M. Villarreal, ASCS Executive Director D. W. McElwath; and Program Specialists; N. B. F. McGuire and Harold Baker.

The meeting will be held on January 18 and 19 at the Adams Hotel in Phoenix.

Announcement of the new program, a continuation of the Agricultural Conservation Program (ACP) was made by Secretary of Agriculture Clifford M. Hardin earlier this month.

Secretary Hardin said that REAP will emphasize a broad attack on environmental problems created by the nation's farming operations.

Chairman Danklefs said that announcement of the new program will permit resumption of the federal cost-sharing of various beneficial conservation with farmers but that public benefit practices such as pollution abatement, enduring soil and water conservation, recreation, wildlife and open space will be stressed. He added that details of the new program will be spelled out by Washington ASCS officials including: Charles M. Cox, Assistant to the Deputy Administrator for State and County Operations; Ray Hunter, Director of the Conservation and Land-Use Division; Leo Schaeffer, Director of the Compliance Division and J. P. Jones, Southwest Area Director.

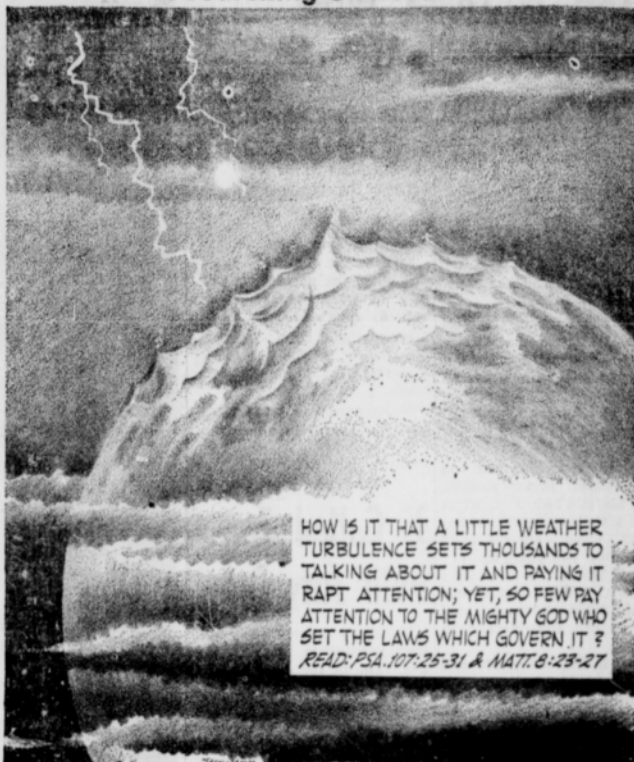

The Apostle Paul also reveals that there is only one way in which we get into the one body (the church). He declares "For by one Spirit we are all baptized into one body, whether we be Jews or Gentiles, whether we be bond or free." (1 Cor. 12:13).

Any who teach any other way of becoming members of the church we read about in the Bible deny the plain statement of a divinely inspired Apostle of Christ. Are you a member of the one body, the one church which Christ established?

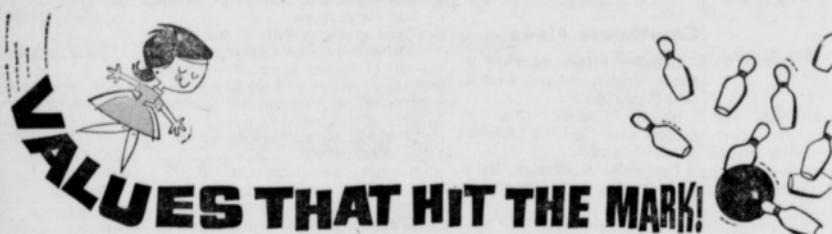

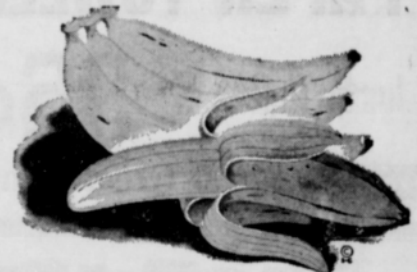
