Better Judgment Suggested in Selecting Breeders for Meat Use.

Prize-winning live stock grabions may come and go like feminine styles, but producers who strive to obtain the maximum returns from their meat animals should select their breeding stock more along utility lines. Only farmers who raise to be consumers who raise they consumers can expect to sell their live stock for the highest prices, regardless of the latest mode at the live stock shows.

At present many cattle raisers are finding that the rashfonable little buils beget calves that grow too slowly. When ready for market these yearlings will weigh only 800 pounds, while somewhat coarser stock will tip the somewhat coarser stock will tip the somewhat coarser stock will tip the yearlings that are making the most money because they more nearly fit the needs and desires of the market. Larger sires will aid many cattlemen, in producing the larger, more desirable yearlings.

Likewise, early lamb producers are coming to realize that they need rams of considerable size, if they are to get the largest possible market returns. For this reason, many farmers are changing to the larger breeds. What will grow fast enough to weight 70 to. 80 pounds at four months of age, and lambs from small parents will not do it.


