

THE sacks of wheat show how higher wheat prices are giving farmers more purchasing power, even without counting the adjustment pay-ments. They show that when wheat was at a fair exchange value before the war, 15 bushels would bey a plow. In the depth of the depression in 1982 it took 55 bushels to buy the same plow, but in 1985 a farmer could buy the same plow with the money from 37 bushels of wheat. The sacks of wheat in the other squares show the purchasing power of wheat in terms of a suit of clothes, paint, and barbed wire.
