



In order to understand the scriptures we must consider that the Bible is God's full and complete rev-elation to man, and that it is all-sufficient to guide man in living this life so as to have heaven for his eternal home. Any other attitude toward God's word will only bring confusion, besides being contrary to the teaching which the Bible itself gives on this met the teaching which the Bible itself gives on this matter

Peter said, "According as his divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain to ife and godli-ness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to giory and virtue." (2 Pet. 1:3).

The Apostle Paul emphatically affirmed that, "AII scripture is given by the inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine. for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works." (2 Tim. 3:16,17)

We must regard the scriptures as fully sufficient as a rule of faith and practice in religion, or we face utter confusion in an attempt to understand what the scriptures teach man. We cannot improve upon what God has said. We must be willing to accept what the Bible says without "Ifs", "ands". or "buts", without quibbling over whether the Lord means what He says. Most of the misunderstanding and confusion in reli-gion exists over what the Bible DOES NOT SAY, and not over what it does say.

For an example, no one could have an objection to calling the disciples of Christ Christians. That's what they were called in the Bible (Acts 11:26, 1 Pet. 4:16). The confusion and misunderstanding exists over calling so-called followers of Christ by human names nowhere authorized in the scriptures.




