Shade for Young Pullets Snade for Young Pullets and is of prime importance for all poultry, especially during the summer months. Where bouses are crowled and shade is not available on the range there will be a high mortality A cheap and adequate shelter may be constructed by driving 2 by 4 supports in the ground and thatching these over with bagging or green branches. These shelters, however, should be cleaned of droppings at regular intervals.
