| BAILEY CO. HOME DEMONSTRATION <br> CLUB NEWS <br> By miss Aismas stewart <br> Home Demonstration Agent <br> Bailey County <br> Uses Scrap Lumber <br> "We have built a clothes closet of scrap lumber and pasteboard, it being two feet wide, five feet long and extends to the ceiling," said Mrs. J. F. Carter, cooperator of the Maple home demonstration club. "We used some scrap lumber to brace the closet, heavy pasteboard boxes for the sides, and had enough paper left from papering the house to paper the closet both inside and out. We wanted to make it light on the inside to keep the moths away. I have a five foot rod to hang our clothes on and have built, shelves for our underclothes and linens. I am using the top of the shelf for cover. I am going to build another one in the other bed room," said Mrs. Carter. <br> New Way To Sub-Irrigate <br> "My husband has laid 120 feet of sub-irrigation with no cost," said Mrs, J. A. Johnson, cooperator of the Good- | land home demonstration club. "He is trying a new way to sub-irrigate. He dug the ditch, just like he would for laying tile, put in four or five inches of rocks and covered these with old sacks, then covered the sacks with dirt," added Mrs. Johnson. "After turning in the water he found damp places would appear on the ground the same as with tile." Mrs. Johnson plans to sub-irrigate much more of the garden. Plans Garden <br> "Since my family will need 530 feet of leafy, green or yellow vegetables and I want to have a variety, I have planned to plant green snap beans, cab, bage, yellow squash, pumpkins, English peas, carrots, tendergreens and Swiss chard," said Mrs. L. G. Harris, garden demonstrator of the Enochs home demdemonstrator of the Enochs home dem- onstration club. "I plan to can 120 containers of these vegetables so I can serve them seven times a week for the five months we do not have a garden." adced Mrs. Harris. She is going to plant six new vegetables this year.
