
Vivian Edwards




Janice Marie Strickland Pope

After graduation she plans to attend Business School later in the future.




Billy Dale Dillard, Jr.




Tony Winfrey


Jerry Dean Fortune

CAPITOL REPORT

By Rep. Lynn Nabers

Last week the House of Representatives began a six day work schedule in order to make the most out of the remaining few weeks of this regular session. Several major bills were considered on the House floor, including the controversial drug bill, competitive insurance rating, and reinstatement of the death penalty.

After two days of heated debate the House passed the drug marijuana bill. However, many amendments were added and the amount of possession for a misdemeanor was set at one ounce or less with a penalty of up to six months in jail and a fine of \$1,000. Although the penalty for possession was lightened, the punishment for the sale of marijuana to minors was raised to a sentence of 10 to 99 years in jail. The House also approved an amendment by Rep. Matt Garcia of San Antonio which would allow those previously convicted of possession of one ounce or less to be resentenced at the discretion of the sentencing judge. This bill was approved with a vote of 97 to 38 and now goes to the Senate for consideration.

The House also passed a bill which would allow competitive rating on car insurance. The bill which is supported by Governor Briscoe was a compromise between those who favor all-out competition and those who favor board-set rates.

A bill reinstating the death penalty was passed by the House of Representatives. The

bill, H.B. 200 by Rep. Dean Cobb of Dumas, states that the penalty for murder in certain instances will be death. This includes the murder of a peace officer or fireman, murder for the promise of remuneration, and murder of an employee of a penal institution during an escape or attempted escape. There was also an amendment approved by the House which would require the death penalty for those committing murder intentionally while committing kidnapping, burglary, robbery, forcible rape, or arson. The bill has been sent to the Senate for further approval.

Also under consideration in the House is the Senate Bill by Senator Bob Gammage which will give equal rights to all 18 year olds.






