WASHINGTON, Feb. 10.-The nomination of Charles Evans Hughes to be chief justice of the supreme court was approved, 10 to 2, by the senate judiciary committee to-

chairman Norris, Repn., Neb., and Senator Blaine, Repn., Wis., voted against Hughes. All the Democrats vavored confirmation.

The committee action virtually assures Hughes confirmation by the senate.

The only important protest against confirmation was filed by Henry L. Doherty, millionaire man of New York, head of the Cities Service corporation. Doherty charged in a letter to Chairman Norris that Hughes' appointment "will lead to disintegration of the court." "will







# STOCK LOSS DUE TO COLD **WAVE SEVERE**

AUSTIN, Feb. 10 - The century's ivestock and damage to cattle. theep and goat ranges during January, according to the Feburary 1 livestock report of the United States of agriculture, issued here by D. K. Blood, statistician.

Condition of cattle decline seven points during the month, to 74 per cent; that of sheep dropped points to 77 per cent normal; that e fgoats six points to 76 per cent nomal, the report said. Range for sheep and goats fell off 11 per cent. and for cattle 6 per cent during

All were below the five year average by appreximately 10 points. "Ranges were covere dwith snow and ice during much of January. "Weeds, brush and range grasses were killed by low temperatures. and cattle were compelled to feed becolly to avert heavy losses," the

Shelter Lacked

"Cattle, sheep and goats suffered where shelter and feed were not provided. Many new-born calves and fall lambs were lost. Losses were not so large as expected, but cattle are in poor flesh and in some areas cattlemen fear heavy losses if Febraury weather is unusually

Many cattlemen are faced with feeding until spring, due to the destruction of all vegetation by the extreme cold.

But the snow and ice put mois-ture in the ground that promises abundant spring grass, the report =

Texas areas suffered by zero and sub-zero weather and destruction \$5,000 ENOUGH of brush and grass, the report said. More feeding has been required than in many years. Cattle that were in good flesh in early winter have come through thin and weakened and will suffer losses if further severe weather follows, the report

Coastal Losses High

The western section is nearest average, the report said. The cold gave livestock a setback, but all classes are recovering. Native cattle are wintering well. Feeding was increased. The spring movement of fat cattle will be later than usual.
