One Victim of Car-Truck Accident Succumbs Last Week

Contrary to many reports circulated in Hico concerning the condition of the three men who were seriously injured here December 15 in a car-truck accident, only one of the men had died Tuesday of this week.

Cecil T. Watson, a passenger in the car, died from injuries received in the crash, and the other two men are still listed in critical condition in a Dallas hospital.

Miss Cox to Retire From Extension Service December 31st

Miss Bonnie Cox, specialist in organization with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service headquarters staff since 1954, will retire effective Dec. 31.

A native of Hico, Miss Cox was graduated from high school here and received a B.S. degree from Texas Woman's University and an M.E. degree from Cornell University. She attended the latter university on a Farm Foundation scholarship and was on study leave in 1953 until returning to her staff position as organization specialist in 1954. She has done other study at the University of Texas, Colorado A and M, the University of Wisconsin and the University of Arkansas.

In making the announcement of Miss Cox's retirement, Director John E. Hutchinson of the Extension Service said that "Miss Cox has compiled an exceptional record of educational service to the people of Texas through her work in Extension. She has a combination of keen and alert intellect, an excellent education, and a deep and abiding interest in and concern for people. These attributes have enabled her to make significant contributions to improved home life in Texas. We will greatly miss her leadership."

Besides training county home demonstration agents in organization principles and procedures, and working with many other urban and rural groups, she also has acted as an advisor in organization to the Texas Home Demonstration Association. In 1957, the THDA named it third college scholarship for Miss Cox. The scholarship is awarded annually to a deserving 4-H girl who plans to major in home economics.

Miss Cox has been active in professional organizations. She is a member of the American Sociological Society, National Council on Family Relations, Rural Sociological Society, and Adult Education Association, the American and Texas Home Economics Associations, Delta Kappa Gamma, Epsilon Sigma Phi and the Business and Professional Women's Club.
