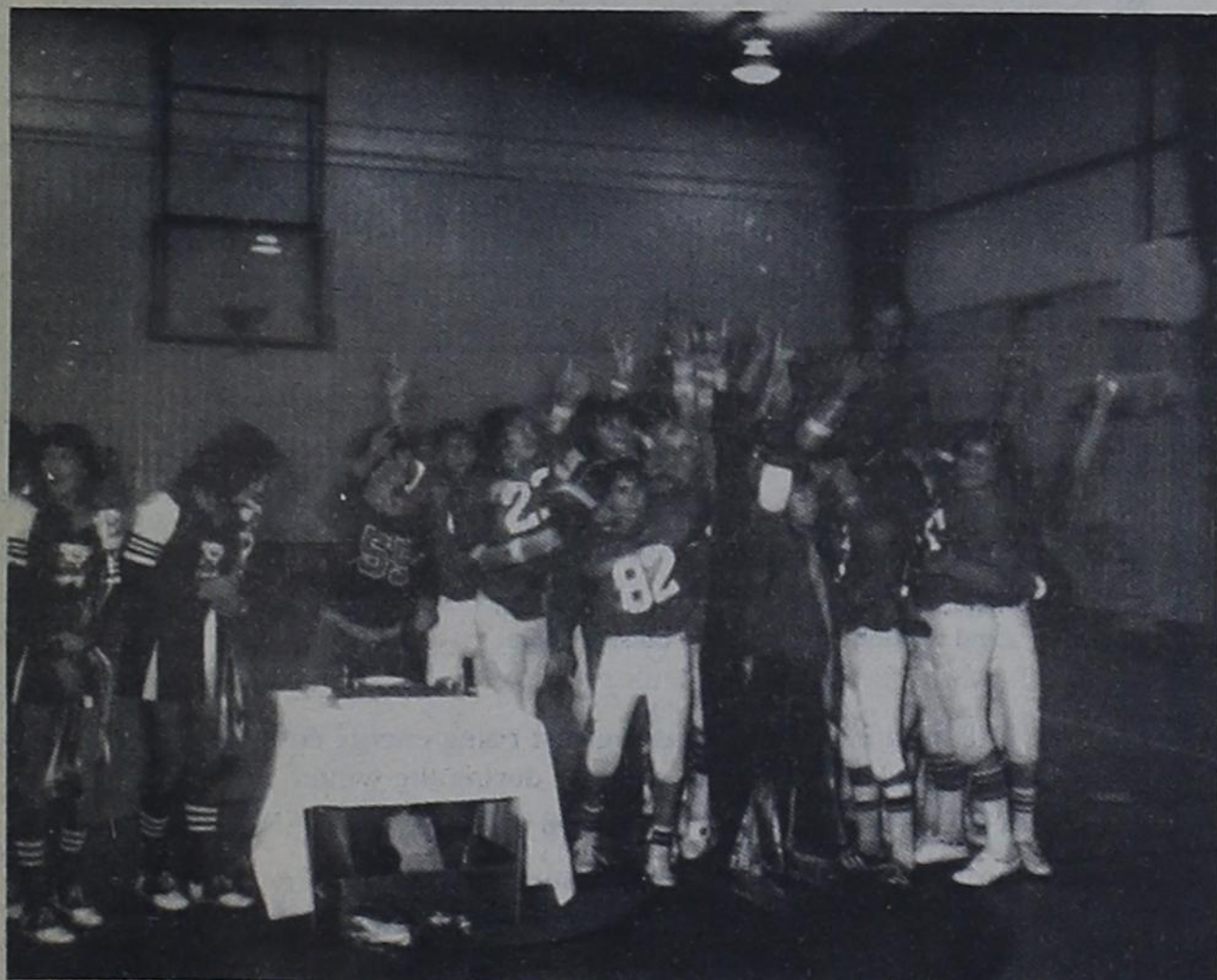


**A HAPPY GROUP OF BOYS—** The Cubs won district Thursday night, with a 24-0 win over Albany.

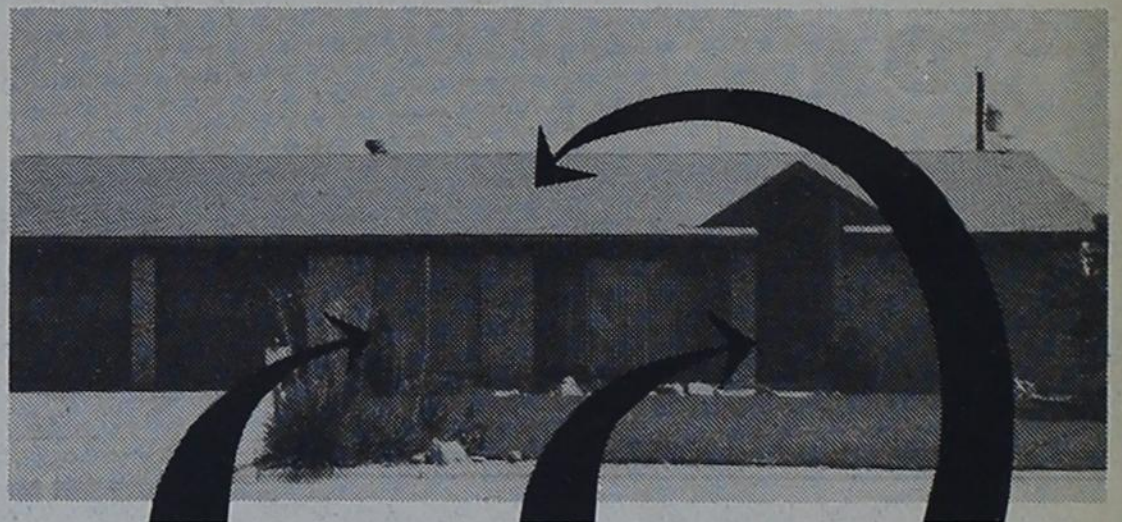

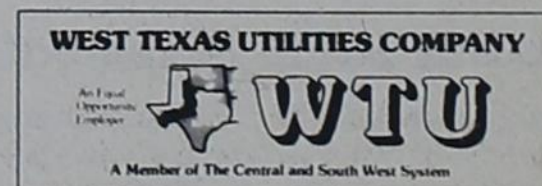

## PUBLIC NOTICE

City of Baird, Baird, Texas 79504, has applied to the Texas Department of Water Resources for a renewal of Permit No. 10037, that authorizes a discharge of treated domestic sewage effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 400,000 gallons per day from the sewage treatment plant which is located immediately to the east of the Baird Railroad Lake dam and immediately south of the Texas-Pacific Railroad right-of-way in Callahan County, Texas.

The treated domestic sewage effluent is discharged into Mexia Creek; thence to Deep Creek; thence to Hubbard Creek; thence to Hubbard Creek Reservoir in the Brazos River Basin.

The permit, if renewed by the Commission, will specify conditions and limitations generally the same as those currently enforced by the existing permit, except the volume will be reduced to 180,000 gallons per day. The expiration date of the existing permit is September 24, 1979. It is proposed that the expiration date be specified as midnight, five years after the date of Commission approval.

LEGAL AUTHORITY: Section 26.028 of the Texas Water Code, as amended, and Chapter 25 of the Rules of the Texas Department of Water Resources.

No public hearing shall be held on this application unless an affected person who has received notice of the application has requested a public hearing. Any such request for a public hearing shall be in writing and contain (1) the name, mailing address, and phone number of the person making the request; (2) a brief factual statement of the nature of the interest of the requester and an explanation of how that interest would be affected by the proposed action; and, (3) the names and addresses of all persons whom the requester represents. If the Commission determines that the request sets out legal or factual questions within the jurisdiction of the Commission and relevant to the waste discharge permit decision, the Commission shall conduct a public hearing, after the issuance of proper and timely notice of the hearing. If no sufficient request for hearing is received within 45 days of the date of publication of the notice concerning the application, the permit will be submitted to the Commission for final decision on the application.

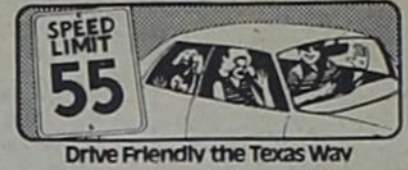

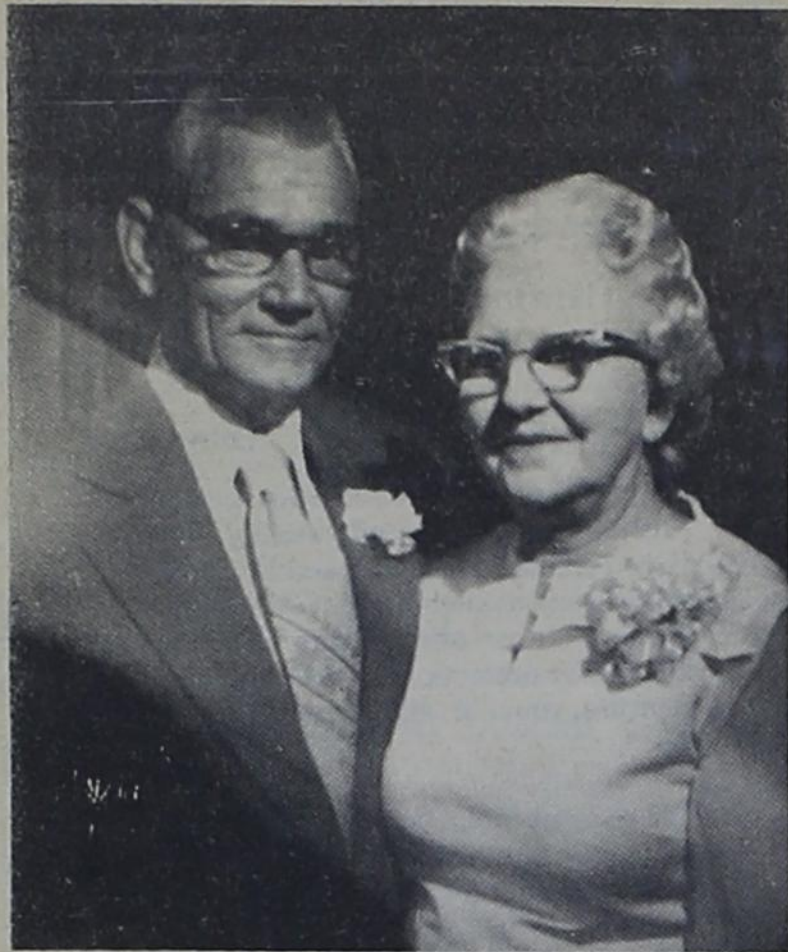

COUNTY- Callahan County has gained a Strawn Sand discovery in the area one mile northwest of Putnam.

It is Jones Co. No. 1-303 Isenhower, spotting 330 feet from the north and 2,475 feet from the east lines of Section 303, SP Survey.

Daily potential was 42 barrels of 39.1 gravity oil, plus 72 barrels of water. It is pumping from perforations at 1,908-10 feet, fractured with 500 pounds of sand and 1,000 gallons of water. Their pay was treated with 150 gallons of mud acid.

The 4½ inch casing is set at 4,078 feet, and the hole is bottomed at 4,089 feet.

Jones Co. will drill No. 1-2270 Pruett as a Callahan County wildcat.

Location is two miles north of Putnam on a 160-

acre lease.

It spots 1,771 feet from the south and 824 feet from the east lines of Section 2270, TE&L Survey.

Proposed depth is 4,500 feet.

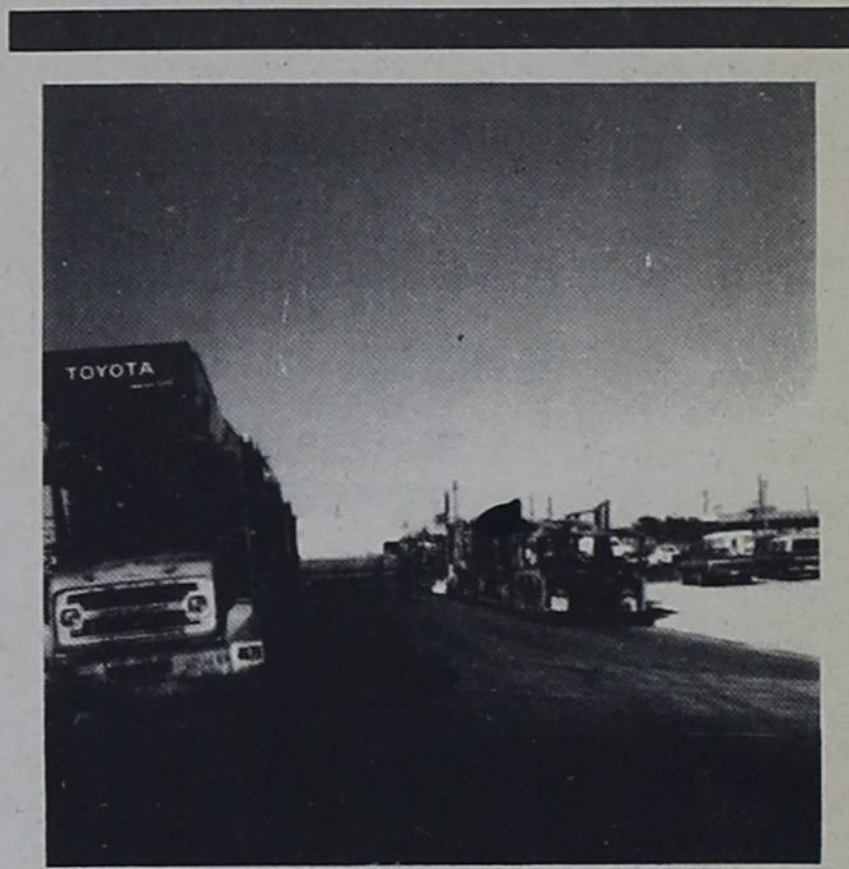
