The poison acts quickly and can kill an animal within a very short time after the damaged plant is eaten. Whether a poisoned animal can be saved deperds upon how soon a veterinarian car. get to it. <br> Frosted Johnsongrass or sorghum should not be grazed until the damaged plants are as dry as goard quality hay or for at least a week after frost. If it is ready to cut for hay before frost, it may be cut cut immediately, provided adequat: curing time is allowed. <br> Young plants or second growth suckers are more likely to causc trouble than older plants nearing maturity. The more luxuriant the growth the more likely the plants will be dangerous when their growth is interrupted. <br> I would like to ask farmers and ranchers to continue their vigilance in controlling the screwworm population. Recent outbreaks have reached as near as Lampasas and this is a most dangerous time of year. When working livestock be sure to treat all wounds. Send any larvae samples to the Mission Laboratory for diagnosis. |
