## High Schoolers, TSC Faculty Member Gives P-TA Program

Parent-Teachers Association first meeting of the new year Monday evening. Bro. H. Emery, Jr., Minister of Church of Christ, gave the sermon.  
Barbara Baley and Rev. Martin related to the audience their experiences at the Texas Bureau Citizenship Seminars. Baley attended the seminary as special representative of the Association. Future Homecoming of America. Miss Martin sponsored by Erath County Bureau.  
Baley related the many things associated with Communism to the P-TA group. She explained that Communism could corrupt the old and alike. She challenged teachers and students to strive for examples that they would be proud to have today's youth follow.

The Halloween Fund Raising Activities will also be studied and improvements will be suggested.  
Miss Mary Fletcher, Instructor of Education, Tarleton State College, was principle speaker. Her topic was "Why P-TA?" Miss Fletcher told the group to be proud of their school, administration, and teachers, and to let the faculty know they were pleased with them. She reminded parents that it was not the paycheck that kept teachers in the classroom, but the teachers' sincere dedication to his profession and his love for children. She also asked parents to stand behind the teachers, and that parents work with the teacher in trying to help the child. Miss Fletcher reminded the faculty to keep abreast of new ideals, teach the students what they need to know, and above all, love them.  
Faculty members were introduced by Supt. O. C. Cook.

## Senator Word Will Serve as 'Governor For A Day' September 20

Austin (Spl.)—Senator J. P. Word of Meridian, was on August 29 elected President Pro Tempore of the Texas Senate. He will serve during the second called session of the 61st Legislature.  
The President Pro Tempore is elected by the Senate to perform the duties of Lieutenant Governor in the absence of that officer and to serve as Governor in the absence, from the state, of both the Governor and Lt. Governor.  
On September 20, Senator Word will serve as Governor-for-a-Day in the absence of Gov. Preston Smith and Lt. Gov. Ben Barnes.  
Word served as County Judge for Bosque County from 1959-62. In 1963 he was elected to the State Senate from District 12, which includes 27 Central Texas counties.  
Born in Meridian, he is a graduate of Tarleton State College. He received a law degree from Baylor University in 1958.  
He served 18 months with the U.S. Army in Korea assigned to the 302nd Military Intelligence Service Company.  
Word is affiliated with Lion's Club, Veteran's of Foreign Wars, Central Texas Industrial Development Council, American Legion, Methodist Church, and other civic organizations.  
Senator Word is the only Senator serving on 13 committees. He is chairman of the Nominations Committee.  
Senator Word and his family invite all the citizens of the 12th Senatorial District to join in his Governor-For-a-Day celebration in Austin.

Hico Volunteer Firemen were called at 8:30 Tuesday morning to the site of a burning diesel trailer truck about four miles east on the Iredell Highway. The truck was loaded with frozen meat, enroute to the Port of Houston to be shipped to London, England.  
Firemen extinguished the blaze but damage to the trailer was heavy.

## Stephenville B-Team is 8 O'clock Foe

Hico's Tigers, averaging a "beefy" 177 pounds in the line and 153 in the backfield, will launch the 1969 football season Saturday night against the Stephenville Bees, a team which slugged the locals 6-0 last season in a drizzling rain.  
The Tigers will start a veteran team in the opener, with lettermen manning all positions except three, where a freshman and two transfers will start. The freshman is 160-pound Galen Lindsey, and the transfers are Charles Woolsey and Melvin Powers. Woolsey comes to Hico from Carlton, and Powers is from Fort Worth. Both of the transfers are inexperienced, but Woolsey joins the team with all-district basketball credentials from a team that won regional honors at Carlton last year. He is aggressive and has shown much agility in drills.

The opener will be the end of a long practice session for the locals, having gone through drills since mid-August. The team is reported anxious to play.  
Coaches Ed Pettitt, new to local fans this year, and Jimmie Ramage, are real optimistic about the team, citing depth experience as being the biggest weakness.

They plan to start Reggie Grover at quarterback, Barry Christian and Galen Lindsey at halfbacks, and Eugene Lindsey at fullback. All are lettermen except Galen Lindsey, with Christian and Eugene Lindsey logging the most playing time on offense last year. Grover was primarily a defensive back, but has had experience at the quarterback slot. Christian also has had signal-calling experience. The youngest of the foursome, Galen Lindsey, is a freshman whom coaches say could be one of the best backs ever to come out of Hico High. He is a real running threat, as proven by his junior high credentials. Grover weighs 150, Christian comes in at 140, and the Lindsey brothers tip the scales at 160 each.

Starting ends will be Charles Woolsey, 175, and Mike Ferguson, 160. Woolsey is a junior and Ferguson a senior. The guards are Rusty Cryer, a senior at 180, and Rickie Jaggars, a junior who also weighs 180. Both are lettermen, and Cryer was an all-district performer last year. The tackles will be manned by 2-year letterman David Ashby, biggest man on the team at 190, and Powers, who weighs 175. Sophomore Lee Ramage, 180, will anchor the line at the center post. He is a letterman, and played all of the last six games last year as a freshman.

Stephenville will field a typical B eleven, with most of the players being ninth and tenth graders, and those ineligible for varsity play. With the exception of two 200-pounders, the team is light-weight, if the roster listings are accurate. Kickoff Saturday night is set 8 o'clock in Tiger Stadium, and a large crowd is expected.

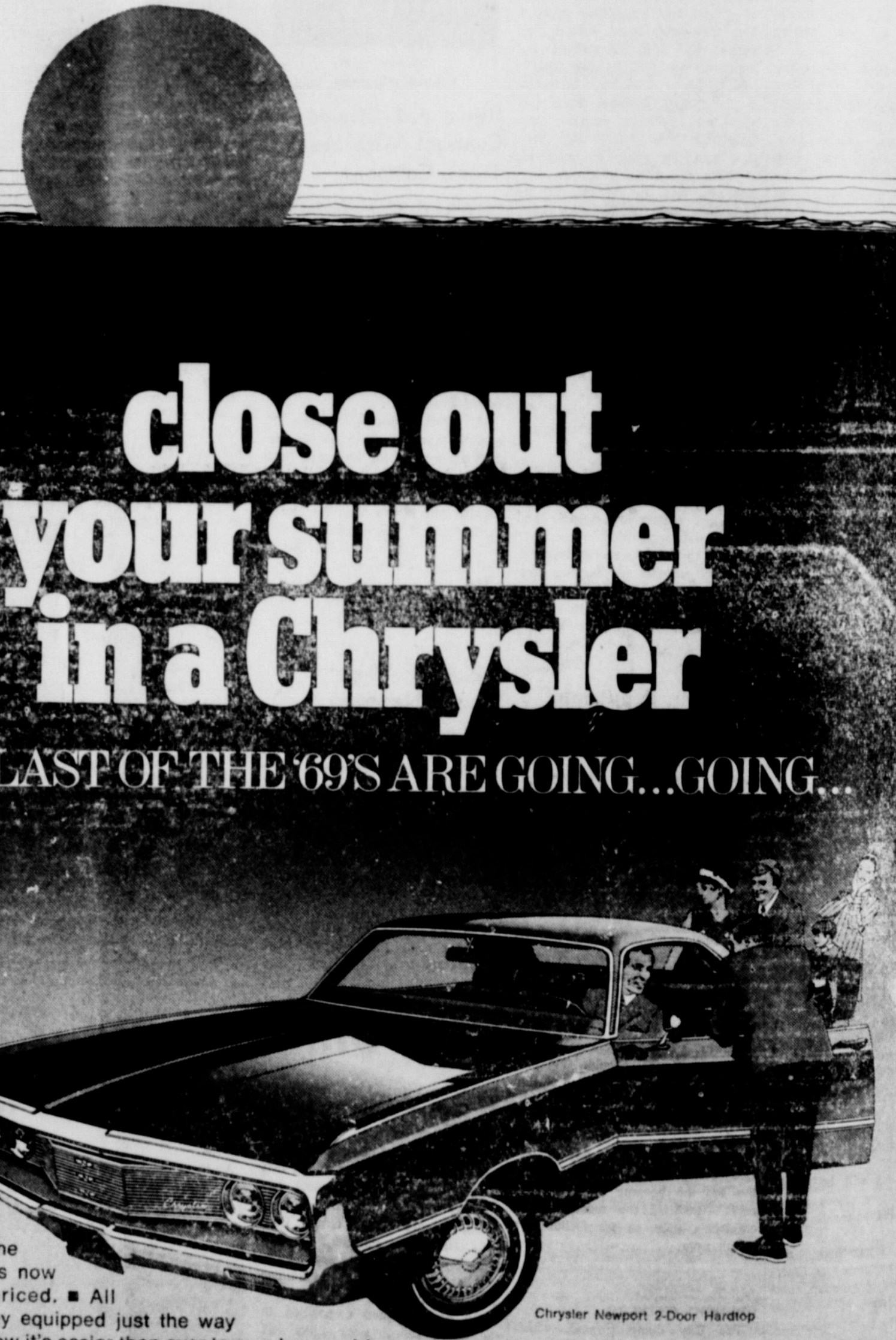

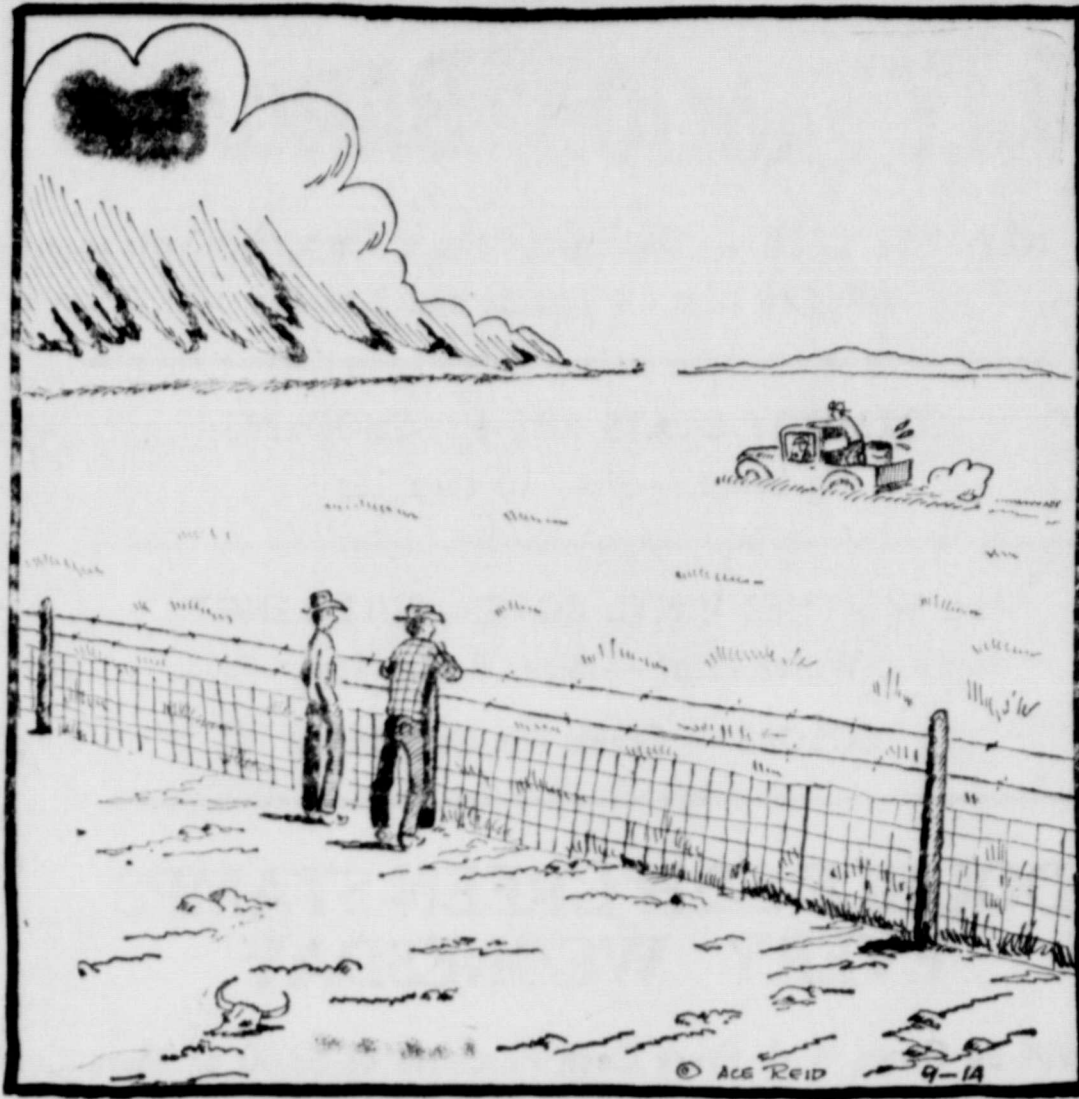
