This is the latest on the school bus law. Quote:

Sec. 104. Overtaking and Passing School Bus. (a) The driver of a vehicle upon a highway inside or outside of a business or residence district upon meeting or overtakng from either direction any school bus which has stopped on the highway for the purpose of receiving or discharging any school children shall stop the vehicle before reaching such school bus when there signaled by the school bus driver to proceed or the visual signals are no longer actuated. 




