Transfer Form

All students who live in one school district but attend school in another adjoining district, or wish to, should pick up the transfer forms in the school office, complete them, and return them to the school office by May 1. This is for the 1982-83 school year.

A student may transfer to an adjoining district but not across another district. Thus students living in Clyde could transfer to Baird or Eula, if it is agreeable with both schools, but not to Cross Plains or Abilene.

The forms may be picked up in any school business office. The forms should be returned to the school office before May 1 then they will be acted upon by the proper school board.

Two young men were attacked and beaten Monday night at the East bound Roadside park on I-20.

Victor Blank and Jerry Wade McDaniel were in the process of moving to Clyde with a female friend, when they decided to stop at the park facilities.

McDaniel was attacked in the back of the men's room, kicked and beaten. His assailant took his wallet, discovering no money threw it away.

Black was attacked upon entering the men's room by another subject, kicked and beaten also, and his wallet removed.

The female companion, name unknown, was in the victim's pick-up when two men ran out and one of them yelled," We're sorry about this!", and sped away in a 1972 green Ceevrolet pick-up.

At 11:49, Jerry Williams, stopped at the same park, and was also attacked by 2 men fitting the same descriptions as Black and McDaniel's assailants.

One suspect is described as, white male, 6 foot, 150 pounds, with dark brown hair and a mustache, wearing blue jeans, dark blue T-shirt with insigma and boots. He also wears glasses.

Number 2 was 6'3", 160 pounds, blonde hair and glasses, wearing jeans, a bright colored western shirt and boots.

Victor Black was treated at Hendrick Medical Center for a broken nose. Black and McDaniel suffered multiple cuts and abrasions to the head and fare.

## **Kindergarten Pre-Registrstion** And Immunization Clinic

Pre-registration of Kindergarten students for 1982-83 for Baird will be held on Wednesday, May 5 from 9-11:30 a.m. in the Elementary Library. Boys and girls who will be 5 years old on or before September 1, 1982 will be eligible for enrollment.

Birth certificates and immunization records are required at the time of registration. An official state birth certificate is required--not a hospital certificate. An official certificate can be obtained by writing to the county clerk's office in the county in which the child was born or to the Bureau of Vital Statistics in Austin. A \$3.00 fee is charged for this ser-

A free immunization clinic will be held at the time of registration. Parents are asked to bring their children to the clinic for T.B. tests and any additional shots that may be needed. All kindergarten students for next year should be tested at this time for T.B., so parents should bring their children when they are registered.




We'll do our best to keep it from happening, but let's face it. Even with the miracles of modern technology, it sometimes occurs in the best of systems.

  - Your name and address
  - Time of the outage
  - The area affected (as many addresses as possible)

We'll take it from there. Please don't prolong the call with questions that can't be answered. We'll be getting many other calls, depending on how widespread the outage is. And, if you're answered by a recorded message, it means that the dispatcher already has been swamped with calls and that we're working on the problem.



Remember, our goal, as always, is to provide reliable electric service at the lowest practical cost. And if an outage does occur, we aim to restore service without delay. We appreciate your help.

#### **VA Answer Questions Concerning Benefits**

The Veterans Administration is often asked questions concerning their benefits. The VA has decided to answer some of these questions that follow:

Q-My GI Bill benefits are not enough to offset school expenses. Are there any other VA programs that can help me?

A-You might be eligible for a work-study program which pays minimum wage for a VA-related work. Disabled veterans receive preference.

Q-I had a school overpayment dating from 1975.

Recently, when I applied for a GI home loan, I was told it could not be processed until I repaid the overpayment. Is this legal?

A-Yes. It is VA policy to reconcile all outstanding debts prior to approving a home loan application. Q--In enlisted in the service in December 1980 and got out in December 1981. Is it true that I am not eligible for hospital treatment?

Generally, benefits are denied to persons enlisting after September 7, 1980 is they do not complete the shorter of 24 months continuous active duty or the full period for which they signed up.

This does not apply to veterans who were discharged for a disability incurred in line of duty, for the convenience of the government or for reasons of hardship.

If you have a question you would like answered, go to any VA office. Their counselors will be happy to answer any questions that one might have.
