

DALLAS (AP) - After learnng he was beneficiary to \$70,in insurance on his wife's ife and saying that he was involved with "another woman," police have charged with murer a 22-year-old widower who remained in jail Saturday in lieu of \$100,000 bond.

The death of Elain Rhodes, 20, took a sudden twist riday when police charged her husband, William Lamar Rhodes, with shooting the oung woman five times.

Rhodes was a patient at Methodist Hospital Dec. 26, recovering from an auto accident, when his wife called him to say he was en route to the hospital o visit him, police said.

About 30 minutes after Mrs. Rhodes was due to arrive at the hospital police said Rhodes became distraught because she had failed to arrive.

Detective Rus Rose said riends of the couple were unable to locate the young woman Rhodes checked out of the hospital to look for her.

Rose said the husband found his wife the next afternoonparked in her car a block from the hospital, shot five times.

Police said they learned Rhodes had taken out four insurance policies on his wife, the last one issued less than two weeks before she was killed.

Police said they took a statement from another 20-year-old woman who told them she had secret relationship with Rhodes and had in fact visited him at the hospital an hour before his wife was due there to

When I received my divorce, the children's father was to pay \$75 monthly to help with their support. To this date, we have received nothing from him. Is this child support routine just a farce of the law?-A. Y.

A father who fails to pay child support is subject to being found in contempt of court and may be fined

up to \$500 and/or jailed for six months. A father who does not live in the same county as the children may be contacted through efforts of the county attorney. A hearing is set with the appropriate court and papers are served if the father can be located.

He must then appear in court and the judge determines if or how much should be paid. The money is sent back through the courts to the mother and children. If these procedures fail, the recourse is rather ex-

pensive. The mother can hire an attorney in the city in which the father lives and pursue the correct course o

I would like to know why boys (elementary and junfor high) have to have a YMCA membership before they can play basketball when the parents volunteer as coaches, scorekeepers, etc., and the schools furnish the gyms, utilities, buses, etc. It seems the taxpayers bear more expense than the YMCA.-P. B.

Chris Olin, YMCA community services executive, states that the YMCA is a membership organization providing services for those who wish to join. Professional staff at the "Y" organizes and supervises programs and activities for all members, and fees are used to defray support services for all programs. Support services would include for basketball, among others, all equipment used in the program, salaries of school personnel used to supervise gyms and fees for sixth grade basketball officials. Volunteer parents are used when possible in all programs because of their interest in young people and willingness to give of their time in these activities. Payment for additional personnel would raise program fees beyond reasonable levels, Olin said.

Orange Lunar Soil May Be Just 10 Million Years Old

SPACE CENTER, Houston (AP) — The men who found it say an orange soil discovered on the moon may be only about 10 million years old, the youngest lunar material ever brought to earth.

A Cernan, Harrison H. Schmitt and Ronald E. Evans said in a news conference Friday that the soil, which Schmitt and Ce...an discovered while exploring the moon's surface, may fill in later chapters of the moon's history.

"It has to be very young," said Schmitt, a geologist and the first American scientist to fly into space. "My guess would be about 10 million

If true, the Apollo 17 material will post-date all other moon material brought to earth. The youngest found on previous Apollo missions was about one billion years old.

Schmitt said the discovery "means that the moon is still active enough to produce volcanic rock."

"It will not have a major effect on employment at the Cape," a NASA spokesman said. "But it could delay the shuttle project about a year."

The delay of 9 to 12 months will be in the buildup of personnel for the space shuttle, the reuseable rocket plane which was to have begun orbital test flights here in 1978. The first flight now is set for 1979.

The space agency announced the shuttle stretchout and other cutbacks Friday in Washington, saying they will trim \$200 million from the agency's \$3.4 billion budget fo fiscal 1973.

The Wrong Question

It started out as a press conference with Dave Smith, SMU's new head football coach, but with only four writers present, it wound up more like a bull session with Orville Henry, the sage of the Ozarks, throwing most of the bull.

Perhaps "bull" is inappropriate. Henry writes for the Little Rock Gazette and is known far and wide as the Oracle of the Ozarks. If there's anyone more concerned with the fortunes of the Arkansas Razorbacks than Orville, it could only be Frank Broyles.

Anyway, somewhere along the line, someone made the mistake of asking Orville what happened to the Razorbacks and all at once it wasn't Dave Smith's press conference any

The Hogs were billed as the coming national champions back in the spring and summer months and the SWC title and Heisman Trophy were expected to fall to the Razorbacks as an incidentals along the way to the pinnacle of collegiate

Henry revealed, despite the hoopla, it never could have been, "And no one knew it better than Frank. He couldn't hide the complete voids at certain positions, such as safety and

Henry pointed out that Heisman candidate Joe Ferguson spent the season trying to pass to his wide receivers, despite double and triple teaming. "Joe's type game simply had gone out of style. I drew a lot of letters from Louisiana folks for saying it, but it was true. That North-South game in Miami was just a replay of Joe's college career." Ferguson that night was intercepted six times.

Ferguson, Henry said, needed the running game to make his passing effective, and without a fullback, there was none.

Dave Seeks Quarterback

Before Orville got wound up, Smith, who succeeds Hayden Fry, did manage to get in a few words.

Much like Grant Teaff at Baylor, Smith plans to go the junior college route for immediate help for the Mustangs, but his big problem will be finding a quarterback to run his Wishbone offense. He doesn't expect to be able to find one in the junior colleges, however.

"There are none from Arizona to Mississippi in the junior colleges," says the Oklahoma State wonder-worker of 1972. "We haven't checked out California yet."

Perhaps the best possibility on campus is Don Jarma, recruited by Smith during a previous stint as an assistant at SMU, and redshirted last season. Smith is sold on the Wishbone. "If a college quarterback

can't run, it's difficult to be consistent. We proved this with Chuck Hixson. Against Ohio State in 1968 we gained 400 yards passing, never punted and got beat. Smith still is bewildered by his sudden popularity as a

coach. He became a hot property after a somewhat modest 6-5 record, but that's something that doesn't happen often at

Stillwater, not with the type schedule the Cowboys play and

the material on hand to play it. In a league dominated year in and year out by Texas and Arkansas, things wouldn't seem to be much better at SMU,

but Smith says it has its advantages. "Oklahoma State is making progress in every area, but there is no means of outside support such as the Mustang Club at SMU. Coach Jim Stanley (Smith's successor at OSU) will receive better support than I had, just as I will have better opportunities than Hayden had. It seems to be something that happens with a change in coaches."

Dirt, Squirt & Quirt

Farm, Dairy And Ranch News

Crop harvest came to a com-plete standstill again in the Midland area last week as ice, rain and cold prevailed during the first week of the new year. Midland County cotton producers are estimated as about two-thirds complete with their harvest, according to Charles Green, Midland County agent. Ginning has been slow also due to the weather.

Cotton in uncovered trailers was wet by the snow and rain and ginyards are still covered by backlogs of unginned cotton.

With the increased incidence of colder weather, proper feeding of cows and calves takes on more importance, reminds Green. The production efficiency and comfort of a mature cow is not reduced by cold weather, provided she is full of good forage, has a dry coat and is exposed to dry, still air, points out the county agent.

These are conditions which are often hard to come by in inclement weather in this part of the state, he notes. The temperature at a given level of feed intake where no additional feed is necessary to maintain b o d y temperature is called the critical temperature.

It is slightly above the temperature at which cattle begin to shiver. A cow on a fasting diet or without any feed will reach the critical temperature at about 55 degrees Fahrenheit. A maintenance ration will lower the critical temperature

to about 23 degrees F. Cattle can keep warm and survive cold weather in good shape if they consume sufficient forage.

Low-quality roughages high in fiber serve as effective feeds during storms because of the high heat production that results from the digestion process.

Therefore, notes Green, the stockman who makes every possible effort to keep his cattle comfortable during periods of cold weather can expect them to work just a bit harder for

In view of the scarcity and high prices for protein supplements, livestockmen might consider the use of whole cottonseed for feeding livestock. Whole cottonseed may be used as a source of protein and energy when the price of a pound of cottonseed does not exceed the cost of two-fifths of a pound of cottonseed meal and three-fifths of a pound of ground grain sorghum, says Green. He said the question of feeding cottonseed has come up frequently in the last few weeks. Cottonseed, he added, is a 20 per cent crude protein feed. Four pounds of seed will furnish as much protein and more than twice as much energy as two pounds of 41 per cent cottonseed meal.

But no more than four to five pounds of cottonseed should be fed daily per head to mature cattle. If cattle are fed too much cottonseed, they may scour badly due to the high oil content of the seed. There is no advantage in grinding cottonseed when feeding it to cattle, advises the county agent.

Yards and gardens are all too often neglected during the winter months. Long dry periods without supplemental irrigation may cause severe dying back on the growing tips. Drying is especially serious on evergreens and late winter or early spring flowering plants, since they have rapidly developing flower buds and require a steady supply of

It's a good idea to water thoroughly at four to six week intervals throughout the dormant period. Shallow rooted plants in containers are especially vulnerable to moisture stress during the winter.

Such plants exposed to prevailing winter wind will require close attention to assure they have adequate moisture to prevent winter injury. Plants located beneath the roof overhang are often damaged by lack of moisture during cold weather.

During cold weather water early in the day so that foliage will dry before nightfall. The most efficient time to apply irrigation water is when the air is calm.

There is less loss by evaporation under these conditions. Much plant damage, including lawn failure, blamed on insects and disease, or on cold injury is often due to excessively dry soil during the winter months. Just because the grass is brown and the trees have shed their leaves, it doesn't mean that the plants don't need moisture. The water hose is still an important tool during winter months.

WASHINGTON (AP) - An dditional \$2 billion may be eded this fiscal year to pay or the air war over Indochina, the Pentagon says.

This would bring the total cost of the war for fiscal 1973 to about \$8 billion, well below the peak annual cost of about \$20 billion in the late 1960s.

Defense Department officials said Friday that at least \$250 million of the extra money is attributable to aircraft lost over North Vietnam during recent stepped-up air raids.
