Four hours later, following more negotiations with police and pleas from some relatives. the gunmen walked out. Two carried stretcher with a third who was wounded and the fourth walked ahead.

Police said preliminary reports indicated their marksmen had not fired a shot since the original gun battle, although the gunmen had fired volleys from time to time.

The government has admitted so far to 56 of its troops killed and 132 wounded since Friday.

The Viet Cong's Liberation Radio claimed 500 government soldier's were captured.

One survivor was Capt. Phuong Van Tau, who commanded one of the battalions caught in the trap. Wounded in the leg, he straggled back today and said he had escaped after his unit was ambushed and surrounded for several days. He said relief helicopters could not land because of heavy enemy fire and his troops eventually ran out of ammunition. Safe Conduct

The commander of a ranger force trying to rescue stragglers confirmed that many of them had been given safe conduct passes by the Communists after agreeing to throw away their weapons.

In a broadcast heard in Saigon Sunday afternoon, the Viet Cong . offered to release 130 wounded South Vietnamese prisoners as a "humanitarian" gesture during a cease-fire from 1 p.m. Sunday Saigon time until 6 p.m. Monday. The broadcast gave a map location and instructions for the South Vietnamese to fly unarmed

helicopters, into the area one at a time. The Viet Cong said the prisoners had been captured Friday in a "major battlefield victory" in the rubber plan-

tation. Senior South Vietnamese officials said the Viet Cong had sent a radio message earlier to government troops operating in the Michelin region saying the Viet Cong were holding prisoners and the South Vietnamese should "come and get them."

At dawn Sunday, six hours before the proposed cease-fire was to begin, South Vietnamese forces moved into the area to recover the prisoners and were ambushed, field commanders said. Ten South Vietnamese and 70 North Vietnamese and Viet Cong were reported killed and 16 South Vietnamese were wounded. Attacked Again

Two hours later, the South Vietnamese said, government forces made a second attempt and were attacked again, suffering 10 men wounded. Enemy losses were not known.

The officials said the South Vietnamese were able to recover 20 prisoners who had been wounded in the battle Friday.

Today a small South Vietnamese reconnaissance plane was fired on as it flew over the area, officials said. And although the area specified by the Communists for the prisoner release was being spared by the allied planes, bombing raids were being carried out a few hundred yards away.

The South Vietnamese officials said they believed the Viet Cong proposal was a ruse to enable them to try to move an important command headquarters and substantial war stockpiles out of the region. Some South Vietnamese sources reported the enemy had more than 200 tons of supplies stockpiled there. South Vietnamese in-

fantrymen had been sweeping in the region to break up a major enemy base that could give them trouble after the signing of a cease-fire agreement. Field reports from another

source said that South Vietnamese rangers abandoned the Duc Co special forces camp, in the central highlands near the Cambodian border, under heavy pressure Sunday. The South Vietnamese command denied the reports, saying there had been a clash at one of the camp's outposts last Thursday but no major fighting. Spokesmen said a battalion of troops was sent in to reinforce the camp Sunday.

In the air war, the U.S. Command reported its fighterbombers flew 306 strikes against North Vietnamese and Viet Cong positions in South Vietnam during the 24-hour period ending at 8 a.m. today, Monday. B52 bombers flew an additional 90 strikes, dropping some 2,700 tons of explosives.



A large and enthusiastic crowd was on hand last Wednesday when the new Senior Citizens Center observed its formal opening in quarters in the First Christian Church. And attendance continued high the remainder of the week.

age bracket to another. Benefits for children (coverage optional). Children receive 50% of the basic monthly benefit. (If you choose to get children's coverage, any additional children you have after you've signed up for the policy will be covered automatically at the age of one month.) At age 19, children get their own policies at the lowest adult rate, and they get

credit for continuous coverage Benefits for people over 65.
