backs, the budget called for \$81.1 billion in military outlays, the second biggest defense budget in history even with the peace agreement in Vietnam. It provided no funds for reconstruction of South Vietnam:

Nixon called his budget a turning point in national policy though still written in the familiar red ink-a \$24.8-billion deficit this year and a \$12.7-billion deficit in fiscal 1974.

The possibility of a showdown also eager to grow more wings. at sea has stimulated some Indeed, the generals used Vietheavily classified contingency planning in the Pentagon. The strategists have recommended moving more missiles aboard submarines, as our land-based missiles become increasingly vulnerable to more accurate warheads. By concentrating more military power at sea, they hope to move the devastation of a possible nuclear attack away from land targets.

The energy crisis also has increased U.S. dependence on overseas fuel sources. The strategists have called for greater seapower, therefore, to protect the fuel shipments.

The "sea war" concept was raised as early as 1971 by the Center for Naval Analyses. In a paper circulated among naval strategists, Dr. Desmond Wilson and Cmdr. Nicholas Brown contend:


