

Cattle Spokesman Forecasts Beef Consumption Rise

AMARILLO, Tex. (AP) - A cattle industry spokesman has forecast that beef consumption will increase in 1974 over the 1973 level

Prior to speaking at the Texas Beef Conference. Bill McMillan, executive vice president of Washington affairs for the American National Cattleman's Association, said Thursday the increase will be greater than last year's level of 110 pounds but will not reach the 1972 level of 116 pounds.

In noting the recent decline of retail beef prices, he said the drop in price of the expensive cuts has been proportionately greater than the cheaper cuts. He attributed this to a cost-conscious public.

Of special concern to the cattle industry at the moment, he said, is the proposed nationtruckers set for Monday.

He said the already chaotic cattle market cannot withstand the effects of further disruption.
