

WASHINGTON (AP)-A tearful Richard M. Chief Executive Tells U. S. Long Nightmare Over

WASHINGTON (AP)-Gerald R. Ford became the 38th President of the United States today and told the nation "our long national nightmare is over."

"Our Constitution works," Ford said as he assumed the office of the resigned Richard M. Nixon. "Our great republic is a government of laws and not of men."

At 11:03 a.m. CDT, Ford pronounced the oath of office Nixon was accused of violating in the Watergate scandals.

Ford was President already; Nixon's resignation was delivered at 10:35 a.m. CDT, and with it the powers of office passed automatically to Ford, a plain man who promised plain talk to the nation.

Ford said he would ask to appear before a joint session of Congress Monday night to discuss "my views on the priority business of the nation."

"As we bind up the wounds of Watergate, let us restore the Golden Rule to our political process," Ford said. He spoke, too, of Nixon, who at the moment of tran-

sition was flying over the Midwest on the way home to California and private life. "May our former President who brought peace to

millions find it for himself," Ford said. Ford said his first speech as President would be no political oration, "just a little straight talk among

friends." He said it will be the first of many. " . . . I assume the presidency under extraordinary circumstances never before experienced by America," Ford said. "This is an hour of history that troubles our

minds and hurts our hearts . . . " Never before had a president resigned; never before

had an appointed vice president succeeded to office. "I am acutely aware that you have not elected me by your ballots, so I ask you to confirm me as your President by your prayers," Ford said.

While he will make what amounts to a State of the Union Address to Congress Monday, Ford settled into the work of office at once, asking congressional leaders to go from the oath-taking ceremony to meet privately

Curiously, considering the claims of many of today's new redeemers, Berg does not equate himself with God. Rather he acts as if God is his domestic who will do what he is told.

And in spite of considerable proof to the contrary — Berg predicted the Comet Kohoutek would hit the earth on or about Jan. 31 — his devotees cling to the notion their redeemer has a hotline to heaven.

According to many reports, Berg's devotees are often in no condition to have realistic notions about their leader or anything else. In a 23-page interim investigation report into Children of God activities, the New York State Attorney General's office reprints testimony suggesting the followers are virtually hypnotized in the presence of the

movement.

Says the report: "Almost without exception, parents who have succeeded in seeing their children in a commune testified that the children appeared to be drugged, glassy-eyed, in a trance and quoted biblical verses in a parrot-like fashion."

In defense, COG officials say such "lies" are typical of parents. The London-based Berg is very down on parents. In

is very down on parents. In one of his letters he says of them: "Parents have filled children so full or house and wars and education and all that. . . . it's like making them eat their father's dung! And now the kids want to kill them for it. You can hardly blame 'em. I've felt like that myself

There is growing suspicion that a great deal of fraudulent religious activity is being protected by the "gray areas" of constitutional interpretation.

Police in numerous towns have received complaints about the philosophy-religion known as Scientology (for a steep fee, the organization promises inner peace). The Council of Better Business Bureaus in Washington says that 25 per cent of the says that 25 per cent of the 1500 inquiries complaints it receives monthly concern religious groups. Animal lovers say that Satanist, a bona-fide religion, occasionally practice animal sacrifice with total im-

Often the religions or groups are well-established and simply refuse to cooperate; Billy Graham, says the BBB, is "one of the worst" for refusing to divulge the disbursement of publicly collected money. Other times the religion or redeemers are "small potato" sects or peoto forbid a fourflusher from selling autographed pictures of Jesus Christ but got so enmeshed in the legal question "I had to give up."

In fact, the investigation of most questionable religious practices is futile. For this reason many lawmakers and

lawkeepers shy from the attempt. "you take these people who lay on their hands for cures," says a Baltimore prosecutor, "We've got a couple in this town. Well, years ago we all knew it was phony and new I see articles written that now I see articles written that suggest there may be something to it after all. What I'm saying is that these things are spiritual, not black and white. We're not going to charge somebody for their funny faiths; if we did we'd have half the people in

New York authorities privately believe the activities of the leaders of the Children of God have flagrantly crossed over the gray line of ligitimacy and into the black of obvious deception, But it is a single example in an avalanche of harmful humbug cascading over the nation. Those who follow the religious scene regularly believe "hun-dreds" of new redeemers and new religions are nothing more than rackets. "Watching them prosper," says one angry minister, "makes one hope there really is a day of final judg-
