Ford Administration Eyes Fuel Allocation Plan

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Ford administration, conceding that voluntary efforts to reduce oil imports have been unsatisfactory, may return to the policies that produced long lines at gasoline stations last winter.

Treasury Secretary William E. Simon and Frank A. Zarb, the nominee to head the Federal Energy Administration, said Wednesday that one possible move to reduce petroleum consumption is to reimpose last winter's fuel allocation plan. Their statements came at the same time the auto industry reported November sales fell 35 per cent, making it the second lowest level for the month in 15 years. The President's Council of Economic Advisers also said Wednesday the national jobless rate will go above 7 per cent next year but the rate of inflation will slow down.







An acorn squash filled with sausage meat, wheat germ and a celery and onion combination makes a main dish that is nutritiqus, tasty and filling. Bake the squash covered first then uncover for the last few minutes of cooking time. A quick way to have a change of pace meal during the coming holidays, filled squash is a good recipe for a son or daughter to prepare and let Mom take a breather from her heavy cooking duties.

Cook sausage meat over low heat, stirring constantly, until crumbly. Stir in wheat germ, celery, onion and teaspoon salt. Cut squash in half lengthwise and remove seeds. Prick cavities of squash with fork and sprinkle with remaining teaspoon salt. Fill squash halves with sausage mixture. Place in baking pan in 1-inch water. Cover with foil, crimping it to edges of pan. Bake in 400-degree oven 45 minutes. Remove foil and bake 10 to 15 minutes longer or until squash is tender and sausage is lightly browned.
