





SAN ANTONIO (AP) — Policemen here became the first in a major Texas city to win collective bargaining rights in a special election Tuesday.

The proposal carried by a to 1 margin in light voting. President Jerry Clancy of the San Antonio Police Association voiced surprise at the overwhelming victory.

State law permitting voters to grant such rights to policemen and firemen prohibits strikes. "We will not affiliate with a union, and this association will represent the policemen," Clan-

Such rights for policemen do not become effective until Octo-ber 1975.
