PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION Senate Joint Resolution No. 7

Proposing an amendment the Constitution of the State o Texas by amending Section 3 and Section 40 of Article 16 the Constitution of Texas so as to permit officers of the Nation al Guard, the National Guard Reserve, and the Offlcers Reserve Corps of the United States, and enlisted men of the Nation al Guard, the National Guard
Reserve, and the Organized Reserve, and the Organized
Reserves of the United States to hold public office in Texas. Be it Resolved by the Legisl ture of the State of Texas
Section 1. That Section 33 of Article 16 of the Constitution of
