### FARM CATECHISM ON LAND RECLAMATION

THE CISCO ROUND-UP

Simplified Questions and Answers **Regarding Farms for Discharged** American Soldiers; Authorized by Government.

The Chairman of the Jocal Red Cross requests the following catechism on land reclamation, work and homes for our fighting men, he published in the Round Up. The questions and answers here given tells about the plans which the federal government contemplates putting on foot for the purpose of furnishing homes for discharged soldiers.

Q. What do you mean, work and homes?

A. Just this: Favorable action by Congress at the special session is expected on soldiers' settlement legislation, similar to that introduced and favorably reported at the recent session. If such legislation is passed, it will enable the Interior Dapartment to begin work at once developing cooperative farm settlements for soldiers and sailors in ' all or nearly oll of the states.

Q. Who will get the farms?

A. Those who create them by working on draining, clearing, irrigating and improving the lands. Q. Will all get farms?

A. That depends upon the amount of land reclaimed.







But this lady who really believes in Cisco replied that she did not want to hold up the people who came here and cause them to form such an opinion of the town that they would leave; that she wanted to see Cisco grow.

Now, that is the town building spirit. The editor knows of another lady in Cisco who lets her furnished rooms at reasonable rates. Neither of these ladies are personated, as they were not speaking for personal glorification, but because they sure enough believed in Cisco and wanted to see the town grov, and when the roll of Cisco immortals are called it is a sure thing their names will be near the top of the column.

The Round Up knows there is a powerful incentive for those to sell their goods in the best market, but when you do this, to the exclusion of what effect it may have upon the future of Cisco, don't stand up and say you believe in the town.

These facts must be kept in mind when considering the U.S. Bureau of Markets report that on June 1, 1919, there were 1,348,000,000 pounds of meats in cold storage. If the meat in storage was placed on the market it would only be 20 days' supply.

This meat is not artificially withheld from trade channels to maintain or advance prices.

Meats in storage consist of-

- 65 per cent (approximate) hams, bacon, etc., in process of curing. It takes 30 to 90 days in pickle or salt to complete the process.
- 10 per cent is frozen pork that is to be cured later in the year.
- 6 per cent is lard. This is only four-fifths of a pound per capita, and much of it will have to go to supply European needs.
- per cent is frozen beef and lamb, part of which is owned by the Government and was intended chiefly for over-seas shipment. If this were all diverted to domestic trade channels, it we'd be only 11/2 lbs. per capita-a 3 days' supply.
