### **DRAWS NEARER** TO CISCO DAILY

With Phenomenal Production of 40,-000 Barrels in Desdemona Field; Pipe for the line has been ordered. Metropolis Continues to Be Center of Field and Supply Point.

The center of interest in the West Texas area has centered in the Desdemona field this week, in the south end of Eastland, the northeast corner of Comanche, and the northwest corner of Erath counties. Most of the new production is in the Eastlandland county extension of the Desdemona field, west and north of the town of Desdemona, in the direction of Desdemona townsite. Reports of Cisco, as well as in the town it- that this well had an initial produc

proposition similar to that of Burkwere completed in the town last week, and a large number of wells are drilling on town lots. West and northwest of the townsite, sevof wells here rivals that of the western extension of the Ranger field.

Over-Production Reported. With the production in the Desdemona field running over 40,000 barrels a day, an over-production has been developed which makes the situation serious. At Austin Wednesday evening was stated that the railroad commission possibly would take steps in the Desdemona field, as well as at Burkburnett, to prevent absolute waste of oil. Last week the production was about 17,500 bbls. a day.

Warren Wagner's big well at Desdemona was flowing into ditches, a wire stated, and in the field there was talk of trying to compel pipe line companies to make connections. However ,the Magnolia Petroleum Co. is running its full capacity of something better than 19,000 bbls. a day, and the capacity of the Sun and Humble lines which went into commission on Thursday is not enough to relieve the situation to any appreciable extent.

The Sun line will take care of the Sun Co.'s production, in all about \* 6000 or 7000 bbls. a day.

The Humble Pipe Line Co.'s line ill handle about 7000 bbls, a day to start with. It is a six-inch field line running into an eight inch trunk

Combined Capacities Not Enough The combined capacity of these three lines will amount to not more than 34,000 bbls. at the most, and it will be at least two weeks before the Prairie Pipe Line Co.'s line to Desdemona can be completed. Work on this line is being rushed as rapidly as possible, but it is considered that good work will be done if the line is running oil within two weeks. It will have a daily capacity of about 20,000 bbls. a day, which, with pres-\* demona now. #### WILL VOX POPULI BE HEARD?

Our old time Irish friend, Bill Poague, from McLennan county, was one of the immortals in that political clan down in Austin who took the Constitutional bits into his mouth and said to h-1 with the Constitution, State rights and the voice of the common people. Yes, we are a law unto ourselves. Bill, why didn't you just raise the governor's salary to ten thousand a year? Yes, why not whitewash the whole shooting match? Why discriminate?-Albany News.

The legislature could have, just as consistently, raised the governor's salary as ratified the suffrage amendment. They had instructions favoring both from the same source. For years the party has been pledged to an increase in the governor's salary by the expressions of the leaders of the party, but the people have never passed upon the matter. The will of the leaders was taken as the voice of the people by the Austin bunch, who justified their action thereby. But the people will forget those who betrayed their trust in ignoring the voice of the people expressed at the polls, and go on voting for that same outfit in the next primary. So the warning of the News and others who see the rights of the people trampled by those clothed with a little brief authority, will avail nothing, because of our primary system. Had the party adhered to the delegated plan of making nominations it is hardly possible that such action would have been taken. But knowing the people soon forget they defied the 25,000 majority who voted against suffrage.

But there was a reason why they would not take the bit and raise the governor's salary. There was a money consideration involved, and the people are not prone to forget when you touch their pocket.

As long as the primary system prevails, so so long will Texas elect little men to office, but it is possibly true that the most infinitesimally insignificant men who are called to fill any office within the gift of the people are those whom we send to Austin. Fool legislation crowds our statute books, and Texas is embarrassed with laws that nobody respects and which are enforced only according to sentiment in particular localities.

Take for instance the insane Sunday law. Everybody respects the Sabbath, but when moral pictures are prohibited from being shown at hours that do not conflict with public worship, and strangers sojourning away from home cannot buy a cigar or a cold drink, but must sit in some corner of a hotel and twist his thumbs, our puritanism is going a little too far. Everybody ought to be moral, but most people want some kind of wholesome amusement. Close the moral places of resort and there is a disposition to pass away the time in the seductive game of draw, or safely hid from the vigilant town marshal, may be tempted to pass the dreary time by setting in a little game of craps. These are worse than moral picture shows, or buying and smoking a good cigar.

#### ROAD MONEY AVAILABLE.

The cashier of the City National Bank of Eastland has been notified that the Eastland county road bond sale has been concluded, and the proceeds from the sale of these bonds would be sent to that bank in a certified check in a few days. The bonds were for \$180,000 and approximately \$4,000 accrued interest, according to information from the county

This bond issue was voted in 1917, but it seems that a previous county administration delayed putting the bonds on the market for many months, and the entrance of the United States into the world war, preparing the proper transcript, etc., intervened to delay the realization upon this issue until the present time

It is stated that when the bonds were voted that Eastland opposed the proposition, and in carrying out that opposition cut down the Eastland territory affected until only preperty in a small radius around the county seat is taxable on the bonds. The bonds were voted for the east and wset road, between Cisco and Ranger. Cisco and Ranger put the election over, and included their property in the tax-

available, how will it be spent? Will it go on the road indiscriminately, or will this money be segregated to the districts according to their respective interests? In justice to both Ranger and Cisco, this should be done, and let the commissioners have the funds according to the property included in each procinct.

This is a matter that should be looked after, and the commissioners court would only be acting fair by segregating the money. Eastland would have no call to object, as she circumscribed her territory when the issue was voted, and now there is no justice in any contention that any more than her prorata portion of this money should be handled by her commissioner.

This east and west road is a link in the Bankhead highway, and was voted to secure the routing through these towns.

#### WHY NOT LEASE THE STRIP?

Eastland county owns a strip of land in the Desdemona oil fields. Just how valuable this tract is, and just how it is situated, the Round-Up is not informed, but oil production in that field continues sensational, and it might be a pious idea for the commissioners to go slow in disposing of this strip. A lease proposition could be better than a sale. In the history of Texas counties there has been a disposition on the part of commissioners to sell county property the first moment it falls into disuse. County farms have been sold, which if held and had not produced a cent, would have been a good investment in inchased valuations alone.

Eastland county can do worse than to let this property by lease.

Congressman Blanton has secured free delivery for Ranger, more and better equipment for the post office at that city, and additional clerical force. Perhaps it is needed more there than Cisco, as the original equipment may have been worse than ours. However, that is barely possible, for the equipment used in the post office here must have been handed down from the days of the republic. There is no indication of any parts being of modern vintage. The clerical force is one of the impossibilities here, as the mail is entirely too voluminous for handling with any degree of facility. Perhaps Congressman Tom will remember Cisco after awhile.

An immoral exhibition is deplored by every well balanced man, and these would be glad to see the better elements in every community take some decided stand for the improvement of such exhibitions. The churches could make great progress by supplying wholesome entertainment of a moral nature for the public, thereby furnishing entertainment for strangers and endearing the churches to the people, and drawing each closer to-

There is a disposition to resist many of the blue laws which are finding places on the statute books of Texas. The liberties of the people are being more and more curtailed until the worm of public sentiment is about to turn. Those who wish to legislate morals into people may go too far, for there is a limit.

Here's hoping that some member of the Legislature will move a reading of the Declaration of Independence.-Waco Times-Her-







### **RECORD VOTE** DESIRED FOR **NEW CHARTER**

Present Laws Under which City Is Operating Has Become Obsolete, and No Longer Meets Demands; Election July 28.

It is the wish of the officers and members of the Chamber of Commerce that a record vote be polled on the new city charter, which will be voted on July 28, that is, the active members of the Chamber of Commerce are working for a full vote of the city to turn out and express their will on the proposed organic measure. If all the members of the Chamber of Commerce desired a record vote they would see it polled, for nearly every business man in the city is a member of the Chamber of Commerce. But some-too many. ute of their means but only wish the commercial body well, without giving of their time and influence to push the good thing along. But everybody recognizes the merits of Cisco's Chamber of Commerce, and the Round Up is not going to deliver any eulogy in this story.

The object is to call the attention to the citizens of Cisco to the approaching election, and to request every voter to go to the polls and express their choice for or against the charter. It is hoped and believed that a large majority will favor the adoption of the charter, as it is a starting point from which the municipality to work, said a prominent citizen yesterday.

"Perhaps the charter is not exactly what you want, but it will serve as a basis on which we can build a city. It is an easy matter to amend the charter after once it is adopted, and finally a charter can be shaped which will be adequate for. the city's needs.

"At any rate the proposed new charter is so far superior to the present organic laws under which we are trying to work, that its adoption should be forecasted with very few opposing votes. The old law is no longer adequate for the needs of a city of Cisco's importance, for such was only intended for small towns and villages, and as Cisco can no onger be placed in either class, its provisions, so far as Cisco is concerned, are now obsolete.

"It is impossible to make the progress mapped out for Cisco under the terms of the present law, as we cannot enforce the sanitary code, nor carry on such improvements as are necessary and desired. A vote for the new charter is a vote for progress. How do you stand? If you wish to see Cisco grow, make a note of July 28, and go to the polls and vote for a greater Cisco by adopting a charter which will give your commissioners authority to enforce their ordinances.
