Carter of Oklahoma, himself a Cherokee, following facts about the character of this nothe receipt of a letter from Secretary of Interior Lane endorsing the Carter bill.

Immediately upon receipt of the letter, Congressman Homer P. Snyder, chairman of the house Indian affairs committee, called a meeting of the subcommittee considering citizenship to meet Monday. The Carter bill with a few modifications will be reported out and presented for passage. Chairman Snyder today was certain that he has the votes in both senate and house to promptly pass the bill giving citizenship to the Indian, who has so long fought it.

ry Tract near the Desdemona Cemetery has been reported. The latest well to be brought in on this lease is the Comanche Central company's well which is reported as making 2,000 barrels a day. The well is near the Terry of Warren Wagner et al. Indications are that the production from this well is about the same as that from the Beaver Valley company's well which is also on the Terry tract. Figuring the Wagner well at 4500 barrels, the Beaver Valley at 2500 and the Comanche Central at 2000 gives the Terry lease a production of 9,000 barrels daily.

So far no reports are available to show that the Jake Hamon well on the Jones town lot in the business section of Desdemona has been drilled in. This well hit the top of the sand last week and made flows which were estimated to be good for 1000 barrels. The well was shut down for storage

In the northern part of the field number of wells are nearing the interesting stage. The Texas company has a well on the Prater tract that shoud be completed soon. The company already has two producers on this tract. The Ranger-Rock Island well in the extreme porthern part of the field is reported to be holding up well toward its initial production of 2500 barrels.

The Dabney well of the Mid-Kansas and the Moorehead of the Ross, Saunders & Moorehead company, both on the extreme western limits of the field, are strong producers. Both these wells came in for 1000 barrels and late reports are that they are holding up well to their initial production. A great deal of development is being done between these wells and the old producing area of the field.

A CLEANER CITY IMPERATIVE.

The report of the Civic committee of the Chamber of Commerce on Clean-up Day is not as flattering as one might have anticipated. The committee, of which Mrs. Susie Webster is chairman, states that Cisco is vet in a deplorable unsanitary condition; some have heard the call for a cleaner city, and embelished the city with really beauty spots, but generally the efforts on the part of those possessed with civic pride, has amounted to little.

Can it be possible that civic pride here is an unknown quantity? Are the people of Cisco content to remain in filth and surrounded by rubbish, when only a few hours work would make a wonderful difference.

The Round-Up has persistently called the attention of the people to the unsanitary condition of the town; the existence of breeding places of germ carrying parasites, and mud holes, which not only mar the beauty of a naturally clean city, but are menaces to the health of every man, woman and child living within its environments.

This paper has no desire to call the attention of the world to the deplorable condition which prevails here-in fact it was anticipated that a more pleasant duty would be the privilege of the Round-Up after clean up day had passed. But only a few responded to the call of the civic committee, and these look like well kept gardens in a wilderness of jungles.

The sad condition is confined to no special section. The unfortunate state of affairs exists both in the resident and business district, and in the latter it is a wonder to those who have seen the result of the administration of the fire rating board's work in other cities that Cisco holds her present fire insurance rate. But this is only temporary. The board is not asleep; a representative has been in he city, and another visit will be paid us in the lnext few days. Warning was given that fire hazards must be removed, and to the knowledge of the Round-Up very little effort has been made to eliminate the hazards complained of. On the next visit of the fire, marshal action, and not words, can be expected, and that action is likely to cost the people of Cisco a pretty penny.

"The next time England will be in the same position as the last time-she will not be ready and we will have to wait for her," is a statement made by Marshal Foch of France, to a correspondent of the Daily Mail which prints an interview with the commander-in-chief of the allied armies recently.

PREPARING FOR NEXT WAR.

Marshal Foch, in the course of the interview, however, pays highest tribute to the British army, but insists that Great Britain should maintain large reserves of military ma terial, saying: "Look at the out-of-date equipment with which we started this war,' the marshal is quoted as saying. "The next war will be more than ever one of machinery. You should have laboratories with inventors always at work keeping you abreast of the mechanical side of war."

The above is strange language to preach at this particular time, when the allied nations and associated powers are being asked to ratify the league of nations. Of course Eng land will be unprepared for the next war; so will America, and every other power, if the league of nations is taken seriously and should be universally ratified by the several powers. Why should we be prepared? We are told that the league of nations is the great and only antidote for war by no less eminent authority than Dr. Wilson, for its his ipse dixit that has breathed the very breath of life into the propaganda that is now being scattered through the columns of all the big press to insure the league's ratification.

But this doctrine from Marshal Foch sounds strange under the circumstances. It gives assurance that no serious thought is given that the league will fulfill its mission-prevent future wars.

Most military authorities admit that the battle of Armageddon has not been fought: that Germany has not been conquered, and that the powers in denying Foch his victory by granting the armistice but postponed the final battle that must be fought to free the world.

If these be true why fritter away the time of national statesmen in quibbling over the league of nations; why not, in the language of the former kaiser, declare it a "scrap of paper," and let our senators and congressmen think about battle ships, standing armies and the biggest navy in the world, or better still, which is more important to a large bunch of self-constituted guardians of public morals, pass the prohibition enforcement act? Lets do something worth while, not fritter away valuable time on a scrap of paper that will be worthless.

Perhaps the business man may say "Well, we will tax the additional cost on our merchandise, ishkabibble."

This is true, but when you do this you are becoming the advance advertising man for mail order houses. Prices now, are just about as high as the people will stand, and if you tax on additional cost of insurance, which you can reduce even below that you now pay, simply because you won't remove these fire hazards, you will drive much of your legitimate business to mail order concerns.

The fire marshal has been here, and parties have written to the health department to send an inspector to Cisco to look into the sanitary condition. His powers are greater than those of the fire marshal. The latter can only punish those offending by raising or canceling your insurance; the sanitary inspector has the power to inflict more drastic measures. Notwithstanding the fact that the administration takes the position that the city is powerless to enforce its sanitary code, yet, under the same law the state sanitary department can bring criminal proceedings, and has the authority to close placse of business which are deemed menaces to the public health.

The Round-Up has no desire to advertise these dark and unpleasant conditionsmore preferable would it be to this paper to write about the beauty and cleanliness of Cisco, as the odor of roses are always more agreeable than the stench of the cesspool, but this paper is of and for Cisco, and would like to see the city put in a condition that would be the pride of every one living here, and the admiration of every visitor who comes within our midst.

Clean up and let Cisco be a decent city.

Don't sit back on the fortune that you have accumulated and let all the new-comers make your town. Loosen up a little on the new Cisco. The new people coming to Cisco seem to be building the town, taking the lead and doing most of the boosting.

Marshal Foch speaks of the "next time" as though this was a certainty, while league propaganda has been preaching there would be no "next time."

Most people will believe that Marshal Foch is the best authority, and will back him up in getting ready for that "next time." If the battle of Armageddon is yet to be fought. all should be prepared and conclude it as quickly as possible.

But this kind of talk from the French Marshal will not bolster up a cause which would be repudiated by the mass of the great American people were they fully informed as to the effects it would have on the destiny of the United States.

There is little in the covenants that will be beneficial to America, should it be ratified, and much that will prove embarrassing.

LEASES AND ROYALTIES DON'T BUILD CITIES.

The business of Cisco seems to be running largely to leases and royalties. Go to some of these land owners who believe in getting theirs while the getting is good, and talk to them about investing in enterprises that are worth while, and apartment houses, with store buildings underneath; a modern hotel; houses to rent to people coming here by the hundreds on every train, they will wind up by telling you to take a piece of land and organize an oil company. People have their eyes on Cisco, and hundreds are seeking homes in this city. Men and women are looking this way for business openings, are anxious to come here and invest their money, but there are no houses in which to live; no houses in which to do buisness. Shall it be said that they were compelled to seek other locations because you refused to take them in. These people are essential if Cisco would grow.

Everybody here is proud of the splendid mineral oil deposits in the Cisco field for many have been enriched thereby, but if Cisco would be great this God given wealth must be properly utilized. Royalties and leases don't build cities, it takes buildings and people.

Let's all put together and make Cisco the city that she is destined to be.

FEAR OF GOD IN MEX. REPUBLIC

Not a Day Since Wilson Became President When Intervention in Mexico Was Not Absolute Necessity, Says New.

Saturday night was field day in the senate to air Mexican outrages, and incidentally President Wilson came in for his share of criticism.

Senators were quick to comment on the insult to the American flag and the robbery of American sailors by Mexican bandits.


Perhaps no other incident in recent months has stirred the wrath of members of Congress more than the present affronts.

"Comment is almost unnecessary." said Senator Watson of Indiana, "We have permitted this sort of thing to go on ever since Mr. Wilson has been president. And it looks as though he tolerates it.

"We shed bitter tears over slaughter in the Balkans; we are tremendously impressed by occrrences in Czecho-Slovakia, we are saddened by happenings in Jugo-Slavia, but we shed no tears for Americans murdered in Mexico. We permit American women to be ravished and American men to be murdered; we permit the confiscation of property valued at millions of dollars. All we do is to writ a few notes. But it still goes on

"There were originally 200,000 Americans in Mexico, protected by sacred treaties and obligations. But Mexico has learned to invade our rights with impunity. Now we do not even write notes. The whole thing is a travesty."

"That is the usual treatment, people were leaving the city on the orders of their government and our flag and our men were fired upon." was the comment of Senator Ashurst of Arizona. "It is just the ordinary treatment of Americans by Mexicans. Every intelligent man knows that County Superintendent Mailing Out acts like that are the usual thing." "It is not the first time the American flag has been insulted in Mexico," declared Senator Fall of New Mexico. "Possibly the Navy Department can give some information regarding the firing on the flag by Car-

500 to 37,500 barrels daily.


