Injunction and Condemnations Galore Follow Effort of New Road to Get Over Texas & Pacific.

**RANGER** FILES SUIT

EASTLAND, March 17 .- It took a quick move in the night to get the Wichita Falls, Ranger & Fort Worth rails across the Texas & Pacific at Ranger, and more litigation has been started in Eastland county between these two otherwise peaceful and lawabiding corporations than a dozen terms of court can settle, according to local parties who have kept track of the trend of affairs.

Early Tuesday morning, T. & P. trains were stopped at the proposed crossing, while workmen completed the crosing.

Several weeks ago the Wichita Falls, Ranger & Fort Worth railroad company filed condemnation suit in the county court of Eastland county for necesary right of way across the Texas & Pacific railroad at Ranger. The right of way was granted and an award of \$350 made. The plaintiff paid the \$350 in to the county court, and deposited a further sum of \$350 and entered into bond for a like sum to secure the Texas & Pacific railway company against any damages and to secure costs on appeal. A few days ago the plaintiff placed its agents and employes on the right of way and began the construction of a crossing for the new road.

The Texas & Pacific desired that the Ranger road construct an overhead crossing at Ranger but the Wichita Falls, Ranger and Fort Worth road contended for the right to construct a inc m grade crossing. "If the News quite understands its action, the Dallas Pastors' association resolved that, as an organization, it could not seek to close places of amusement on Sunday; that its members were free to exercise their political authority as individual citizens to bring about such an interpretation and enforcement of the laws as they deen right, and that, as ministers, it was their duty to cultivate such a sease of respect for the sanctity of the Sabbath as would result in compelling the closing of all places of amusement on Sunday. It seems to the News there can be no dissent from any of those conclusions. Regardless of what one may think are the social and moral effects of permitting places of amusement to remain open on Sunday-and the News is among those who believe that the effects are salutary rather than harmful-there can be no questioning the propriety of the procedure which the Pastors' association has set forth. It keeps within its province as an organization, takes nothing from the rights of its members as citizens and leaves their illimitable field of duty as ministers uncircumscribed. Furthermore, it recognizes the profound and important truth that no spiritual triumph is achieved by the use of the law's force, and that the church acknowledges itself defeated when it calls to the police to enforce an obedience of its precepts."
