Sudan grass, which is regard the world for dairy cattle, is the surest crop of West Texas. It is now produced in practically every state of the union, but this section of West Texas furnishes the big end of the seed. Forty acres of sudan grass is generally conceded to be equal
to two sections of native gras for cattle feeding.
During the past twelve mon ths the product from Muleshoe has been shipped to every state in the Union and much
sold to export of seed. Sudan is grown by the dry
