

THE KANSAS CITY Star received the following letter anent the next morning." teachers' hours and pay. Let us rejoice that this sentiment as to the functions of the teachers of present and future generations is Vince. not universal. Here's the letter;

'Kansas City teachers have not had an increase in salary, and I wish to ask if men and women who work only five or six hours a day, five days a week and nine months a year are not very well paid already? The summer vacation months may be turned to profit in many ways by the teachers. Many resorts offer employment in waiting on tables. Or a teacher may act as governess, tutor, dress- Brooklyn. maker or even as a cook on large farms. Men are needed in every writer. industry in the summer, especially on the farm."

"Questions of this kind in reference to the work and pay of teachers are often brought up. They are the result of a fundamental misunderstanding of the function of the teacher and the nature of his service. 
