





For this reason part of the parachute device must be lost automatically when the apparatus has fallen into air of a certain density. with additional parachute devices rendered operative as the rocket nears the ground. Such devices have not been fully worked out by Professor Goddard, but he says they would be of simple and light construction.

## Something to Avoid.

When cutting trees back, never cut the top out of trees very far back, as this destroys too much leaf surface, and forever ruins their beauty, and creates cavities where cuts were made, and eventually you have hollow trees weakened and diseased, and the prey to every windstorm that blows.

This practice is generally followed because the trees have become too lofty, and fear is felt that they may blow ever, but decay always sets in where cuts are made, and after a few years the trees are more of a manmade menace than a nature made one, and as nature generally cares for its kind, it is far better to let nature take its course, with the assistance of judicious and careful attention of trained men, rather than the destruction of God's handiwork by men who practice or allow such vandalism,
