

90 Of 120 Required Mattress Requests Received Here
Up to date 90 applications for mattresses have been received in the County Extension office. In order that Bailey county may receive the cotton and ticking, there must be at least 120 applications, and it surgent that applications be made as soon as possible, said Miss Lillie Gentry.

Anyone is eligible who made \$40 for less during 1939, one-half of which was made on the farm or who is a bona lide farmer making less than \$400, no matter what the source of the income is.


