



Holmgreen Thinks Ranchers Led **Farmers**

Texas farmers and ranchmen who last year let \$3,447,310 slip through their fingers by not earning their maximum soil-building and rangebuilding allowances are not going to make the same mistake twice.

With only three months to go before the deadline for earning 1939 allowances under the Agricultural Conservation Program, a maximum of \$12,694,000 is available as payment for soil-building and rangebuilding work in the state, E. N. Holmgreen, state AAA administrator, has announced.

Farmers in the state last year let the ranchmen run rings around them when it came to taking advantage of the assistance offered by the government in soil by ilding work.

In 1938 the maximum soil-build ing allowance for all farms in the state was \$6,617,706, but the farmers earned only \$3,675,271, or 55 percent. The maximum for 1939 is \$6,-205,000 and a much larger percentage is expected to be earned.

For range-building in 1938 the maximum which could be earned in the state was \$6,155,748, of which \$5.650,873 was earned, the ranchmen thus collecting more than 9! percent of the maximum allowance.

During the current year a maximum of \$6,489,000 is available with earnings expected to pass 95 percent of that amount.

Soil-building allowances for farms are figured on the difference between the total cultivated acreage and the acreage devoted to cotton wheat and general crops with each acre worth 50 cents in the allowance In addition, 2 cents per acre of noncrop open pasture land is allowed and \$1 is added for every animal unit the pasture is normally capable of grazing.

Ranch - building allowances are figured at 2 cents for each acre of range land plus \$1 for each animal unit of grazing capacity.

ORDINANCE

PRESCRIBING THE RATES TO BE CHARGED FOR GAS SERVICE; PRESCRIBING THE TIME AND PLACE FOR PAY-MENT OF ACCOUNTS; PRO-VIDING PENALTY FOR FAILURE TO PAY ACCOUNT WITHIN THIRTY DAYS AND PROVIDING FOR CONDI-TIONS UPON WHICH SER-VICE WILL BE RESUMED; REPEALING A L L ORDI-NANCES IN CONFLICT HERE-WITH; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City Commission has heretofore determined that it is to the best interests of the City and ci its citizens that a municipal gas system be constructed in and for said City; and

WHEREAS, the City Comission is at this time in the process of issuing bonds and contracting for the construction of said gas system; and

WHEREAS, it is proper and necessary in connection with said gas system for the payment of operating expense and for the payment of the principal and interest on said bonds to, at this time, set the rates to be charged for service in connection with said gas system;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SPUR, TEXAS:

1. RATES: There shall be charged for gas service in said City for each

- 20c per Th 7.5 Th 18c per Th 10 Th 10.8c per Th - 12c per Th 6.3c per Th - 7c per Th A Therm (Th) being defined as the amount of gas necessary to release 100,000 B.T.U when burned. The price under "Net" is the actual price if paid by the 15th of the month immediately following the date of the bill. If not paid by the 15th the "Gross" price will be charged.

The above rates are minimum monthly rates.

2. TIME AND PLACE OF PAY-MENTS: All accounts shall be payable on the first day of each month, at City Hall in Spur, Texas. The City Clerk shall prepare statements for the gas service on the last day of each month. He shall discontinue service to any connections on which the statement shall not have been paid on or before the 25th day of the month following the date of the delegate to the National FFA Con- statement. After service has been discontinued by the instructions of the City Clerk, it shall be unlawful ter to Crosbyton District officers for any person or property owner to reconnect said service or to attempt
