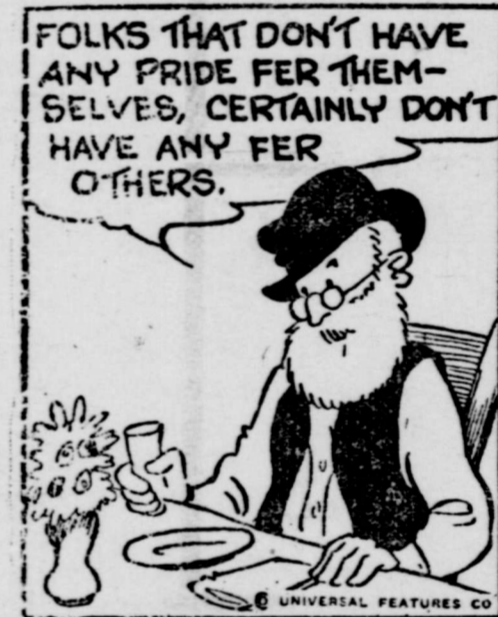

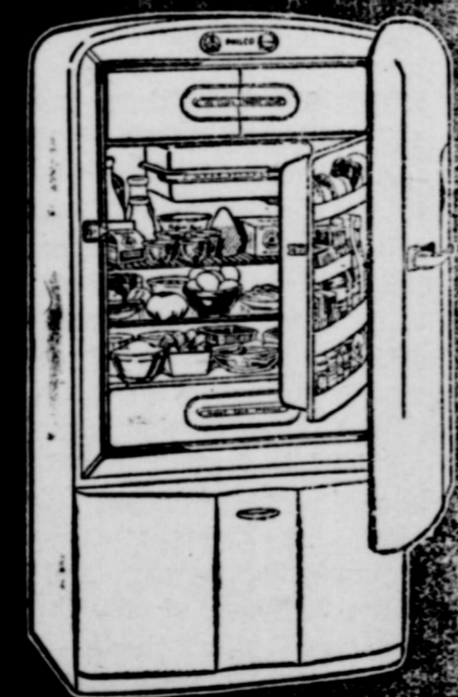

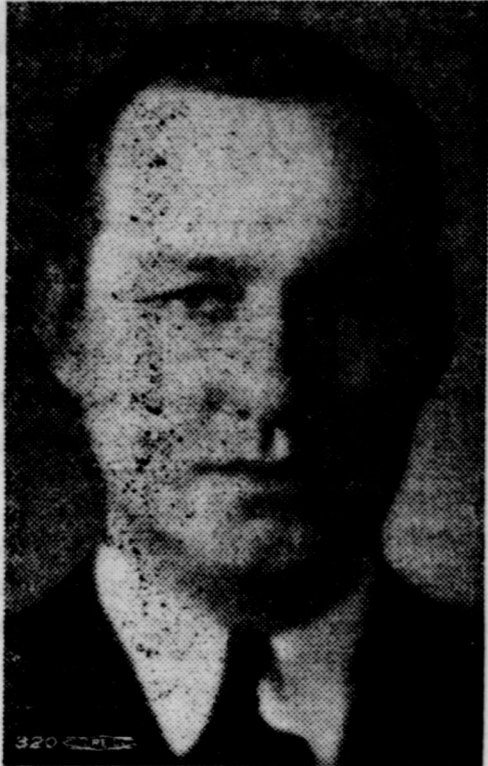

4-H COOPERATOR OF PATTON SPRINGS HAS EARLY GARDEN

"I have a good stand of radishes, lettuce, and mustard growing in my frame garden, which was planted the second week in March," said Mary Nell Smith, Garden Cooperator in the Patton Springs 4-H Club, to the Home Agent at a club meeting Wednesday.

"My frame garden is small so that I can take care of it myself—about 4 ft. by 12 ft.—and it is covered with unbleached muslin and hail screen. This keeps out the dust and wind and also the cat that likes to play on the cover."

These frame gardens have gained in popularity over the county for small garden plots for growing table vegetables early in the season—vegetables that otherwise might be covered with sand or blown off by the wind. The protection offered by these small frames keeps the ground moist and assures greater production per foot than gardens planted in the open.
