The Duck Creek Soil Conservation District covering approximately 1,133,545 acres in Dickens, Kent and Sonewall counties became one of
he two first Texas soil conserva tion districts to pass from the plan-
ning to the operations ning to the operations stage in a
soil and moisture conservation program. This step was taken when a basie
memorandum of understanding was memorandum of understanding was
signed by the district's five-member board of supervisors and Secretary
of Agriculture Wickard. This memorandum, according to R. R. Wocte-
of McAdco, chairman of the board of supervisors, was based on a long-
time district erosion control and
water conservation ed by the supervisors with the as-
sistance of farmers and varicus local,
state state and federal agencies. As a re-
sult of the memorandum, agencies
of the U. S. Department of of the U.S. Department of Agricul-
ture may assist the 1,737 farmers and ranchers of the district in es-
tablishing complete conservation
systems on their lands, Wooten explained.
