J. B. Reed Attends Farm Loan Asso. **Meet in Lubbock**

James B. Reed, secretary-treasurer of the Spur National Farm Loan Association, on his return July 7 from a meeting in Lubbock of secretary-treasurers in this part of the state, said that amendments to the Federal Farm Loan Act will provide improved long-term credit service to agri-

Bank loans of 65 per cent of the normal agricultural value of a farm or ranch," he said. "The legislation also permits the Land Bank under certain conditions to purchase notes and mortages from the Federal Farm Mortage Corporation. This would reduce the interest rate on Land Bank's Commissioner loans acquired by the Land Bank from 5 percent to the Land Bank's rate of 4 per cent, and also give the borrower the advantage of having only one







drying. TO SULPHUR FRUIT: Place one teaspoon of sulphur per pound of prepared fruit in a piece of paper, roll it loosely and twist the ends. Then place it in a shallow pan. Place the pan below the tray or trays (should be slatted or made of wire and coverd with thin cloth) of cut fruit so they will not come in contact with burning sulphur. Light the paper, then quickly place a tight box or barrel over the trays and the pan. The covering should be tight enough to prevent loss of fumes. THIS SHOULD BE DONE OUT OF DOORS. Time to sulphur peaches is 15 to 20 minutes, if peeled; 3

hours if unpeeled. Thoroughly dried fruits when pressed tightly in the hand will not be sticky and will have a tendency to spring apart when the grip is released.

Store Dried Products This Way Food taken from drying trays is not uniformly dry. Portions which are moist may cause mold to develop, so obtain an even degree of moisture, place the products into deep containers and stir each day for 8 to 10 days. This is known as conditioning. If the food is too moist after conditioning, return to drier. Heat all products for 15 to 30 minutes at a temperature of 150 degrees F. to 180 degrees F. before storing to protect them from infestation by certain kinds of beetles and moths. All dried foods should




