Veterans and dependents of deceased veterans of the Indian Wars will receive a 20 percent increase in their service pensions effective with payments due for the month of March, the Veterans Administration has announced.

The increases are provided in Public Law 398 of the 80th Congress approved January 19. They affect about 750 living veterans, 2,100 widows and some 50 help-less children of deceased Indian War veterans.

Under the increased rates which followed the granting of similar increases for pensioners of other wars, the veterans will receive from \$24 to \$120 a month, depending upon extent of dis-ability, age and qualifying sta-tute. Widows' rates will range from \$36 to \$60 monthly, with additional allowances for child-

VA said the average age today of Indian War veterans is 85 years, and that dependents average 80 years of age
